MONUMENT FUND.

CITIZEN'S MEETING.

A meeting of citizens has been called at the City Council Chamber at 4 o'clock next Monday afternoon, in the interest of the Patriotic Monument Fund. All citizens interested in this worthy object—and who is not?—should make it a point to attend. The Premier, the District Officer Commanding the Militia, the Mayor and Councillors and leading citizens are expected to be present and give their endorsement and support to the movement, while taking counsel together as to the means by which the much desired object can be best promoted.

The other day a leading Halifax paper published a cut of the fine monument erected in St. John to the memory of brave Frederic Young, a Charlottetown boy, who gave up his life in a heroic effort to save another from drowning. Thus the noble self sacrifice of a worthy Islander has been recognised in other and distant cities. We ought not to be less mindful of the memory of our own brave soldiers who have perilled and given up their lives for the country. They ought to have a monument here in our midst as a testimony to their worth by grateful fellow-citizens, and as a perpetual incentive to courage and patriotism to future generations.

Long ago when the Island was little more than half as populous or wealthy as at present, in the days of the Crimean war, every school in Prince Edward Island contributed to the Patriotic Fund of that time and £310 was cheerfully contributed. In that distant war Canada had taken no direct part, but teachers and people took a deep interest in the Patriotic Fund. Among the teachers of that day was Hon. David Laird, who was a zealous promoter of the movement. Now the conditions are different. Canada summoned her sons to take part in the South African war, and our brave Islanders responded to the call, fighting and falling side by side with the brave soldiers of Britain, Ireland and Australia. Surely we owe them a monument to perpetuate their fame.

There are some monuments in Canada, but all too few, erected in memory of brave men who died for their country. Wolfe has his monument at Quebec, Nelson in Montreal, General Brock at Queenston and Brant in Brantford. Toronto has a

35 LIQUOR DEALERS FINED.

Crusade Against Selling in Cape Erton Mining Towns by the Dominion Coal Co.

SYDNEY, Oct. 10.—Thirty-five liquor dealers have been fined \$50 each in town since the 15th of August.
