FREDERICTON MAN IN ALLEGED INTRIGUE

FREDERICTON, Dec. 8.—Announcement of an action which has been entered by an advertising man, who has spent the past summer handling a proposition in connection with local moving picture theatres, against a local business man, a member of one of Fredericton's prominent families, created a sensation here. The action is for unstated damages for loss of the society and services of the plaintiff's wife. It is said the amount of damages claimed will be \$10,000. A local legal firm have been retained by the defendant to appear in the case and carry on defence. Friends of the defendant claim the case is a frame-up.

FRENCH CAPITALISTS ISSUING PETITION

QUEBEC, Dec. 8.—La Canadienne, a financial review published in Paris, says a number of subscribers to the stock of the Quebec and Saguenay railway and other disinterested parties in France, are to send a petition to Premier Gouin. The petition which it publishes asks Mr. Gouin in the interests of Canada to maintain its good name with French financiers to complete the line. It speaks of the number of people of French descent in Canada and the efforts being made to bring them closer in business relations. It adds, if the building of the railway in question is not completed it will be a set back to Canadian interests.

82 FISHERMEN LOST.

LISBON, Portugal, Dec. 9.—Eighty-two Portuguese fishermen lost their lives during a recent storm on the coast of Portugal.

Four days ago a fleet of 100 small fishing vessels whose crew totalled 192 men were caught in the gale. Up to the present 110 of the men have returned, and it is almost certain the remainder went down with their crafts. The survivors suffered severe privations. They were without food or water for three days while the seas were very heavy and cold winds prevailed. Four of the fishermen became insane, jumped overboard and were drowned. Six bodies have been washed ashore on the northern coast.

PREPARATIONS FOR CONSECRATION.

ST. JOHN, Dec. 9.—There is an unprecedented assemblage of Roman Catholic Clergymen here to-day and there will be more tomorrow for the consecration of Bishop LeBlanc tomorrow. They will include His Excellency Mgr. Stagni, the apostolic delegate who will officiate, four Arch-Bishops, eight Bishops, many monsignors and heads of colleges and priests in all 140 or 150.

Mgr. Stagni arrived at noon today and was escorted to the Cathedral where an address was presented. The consecration takes place at 10 tomorrow. Arch-Bishop McArthur of Halifax and Bishops of Montreal will assist in the consecrating. The ceremony will be followed by a dinner given to the delegates by Bishop LeBlanc at which all local and visiting clergymen will attend.

GRAND DUKE MICHAEL DOES NOT WISH CROWN.

ST. PETERSBURG, December 7.—Emperor Nicholas and the members of the imperial family are greatly upset by the determination of the emperor's only brother, Grand Duke Michael Alexandrovitch, definitely to renounce his rights of succession to the throne. The morgantic marriage contracted in 1910 by the grand duke with the divorced wife of a brother officer was recently blessed by the birth of a son. This event prompted Grand Duke Michael's decision. He wished to retire to the private life of a country gentleman, assuming the title of count, in order to enjoy domestic bliss far from the atmosphere of the court, for which he never had any great predilection.

The sons of the late Grand Duke Vladimir, who would become the next candidate for the throne, unhappily share their father's intense unpopularity. All classes of well-informed Russians indeed regard the possibility of their ascending the throne as disastrous for the dynasty.

JACOBSON MURDER TRIAL EXCITES INTEREST.

HOULTON, Maine, Dec. 7.—Interest in the Jacobson murder trial has extended across the Canadian border and a number of New Brunswick residents have been among the spectators in the court room. When the trial was resumed today, the State had thirty witnesses waiting to support its contention that Charles Nelson Emelius, a student preacher, his mother-in-law, Mrs. Annie Jacobson, and her son, shot to death C. Augustus Jacobson at New Sweden in 1911. Sixty-five witnesses have been summoned by the defence. Emelius has written a brief sketch of his life. He was born on a Minnesota farm and began his church career as a Lutheran missionary at Oakland, Cal. He was stationed later at Marshalltown, Iowa; Boston and Rochester, N. Y. He says that although he was licensed to preach he never was ordained.
