CANADA AND THE EMPIRE.

Col. Sam Hughes is a sort of champion imperialist at Ottawa, and the other day brought up again as he had done two years ago, the question of the closer union of the British Empire.

It is admitted on all hands that the Colonies, as they are called but really nations, are all abundantly loyal to their sovereign and united in their desire to remain within the Empire.

It is sufficiently obvious that any new departure when it comes must be in the direction of closer political union, or in the opposite direction of practically severing the slight silken cord which now binds the overseas British nations to the central Kingdom.

True, the feeling grows in the British Isles and also but more slowly in Canada, and other large self-governing Colonies, that the burden of imperial defence ought not to fall so entirely as it now does upon the United Kingdom.

So far the imperial federalists have not been able to formulate and agree upon any system of federation that would meet the existing conditions and prove acceptable alike to the Mother Country and the other members of the imperial family.

The enormous cost of the British army and navy, amounting to ten dollars per head per annum of the British people is a staggering proposition for the people of Canada to contemplate taking a share in.

Perhaps in the happier years to come a dismemberment of the nations may be brought about, that will make the financial difficulties of the imperial problem disappear.

Time solves many problems in ways unforeseen and will solve this one. It would be a mistake to attempt to hasten the solution by "a union upon parchment" adopted without the most mature consideration. Such action might prove

LORDS AND COMMONS.

The British Parliament was opened on Tuesday last by King Edward in person with a speech of more than ordinary import. One passage refers to the controversy between the two Houses owing to the Lords having rejected the education bill.

It seems probable that this rather vague language points to a proposed reconstruction of the House of Lords in some way, and not to its abolition. In any case the King no doubt has been made acquainted with the substance of the proposed measure and has given it his sanction.

Lord Lansdowne as spokesman for the Liberal-Unionist majority in the Upper House is a defiant note, "They are perfectly willing to meet the Government in or out of Parliament on the question of reforming the House of Lords," he says.
