Contract Bridge

GOOD PLAY AND BAD

Today's declarer played the hand well to make his game contract, but he was helped by a slight error on the part of each defender.

South dealer
Both sides vulnerable

♠ A 4 3 2	♣ 7 6
♥ 6 5 2	♦ J 10 8 7
♠ K Q 8 5	♣ 4 3

The bidding:
South West North East
1♥ 2♣ Pass Pass
3♥ 3♣ Pass Pass

South leads the spade jack from his own hand. Naturally, West covered with the queen, and declarer let him hold the trick. At this point West's logical defense was to lay down the spade king, but instead he exited with a low spade. Dummy cucked and South won with his own ten. The spade five was now led to the ace and a club was returned. Once more the fate of the contract hung in the balance, this time depending on East's play. If East had been wide awake to what was developing, he would have made the unusual but vital play of the club ten, on the lead from dummy. This would force South to play the queen or ace, and would inevitably result in South's loss of two club tricks. When, however, East, humanly enough, followed suit with a low club, South played the club eight—and West was "hooked". Although he could win with the nine, he then had to return a club up to declarer's major tenace, or a spade that could be ruffed in one hand while a club was discarded from the other hand.

RAW MATERIALS LACK HURTS LACE INDUSTRY

LONDON, Sept. 25 (AP)—Britain's lace industry is in danger of losing world markets because of a shortage of raw materials and labor, said the report issued by a Board of Trade "working party" which investigated conditions in the trade.

It said the government has been asked to give "all possible facilities and consideration" in all sorts of materials to the industry which it terms "peculiarly suited for the operation of private enterprise, provided it is so organized as to ensure co-operation as well as competition."

The report said powers should be sought to raise a compulsory levy from the industry to pay for scientific, technical, economic and market research work and the establishment of a design and fashion centre.
