TORONTO, June 15—(CP)—Activity on the Toronto stock exchange on Saturday slackened to show the smallest volume in more than a month at \$1,000 shares.

Canadian Car pfd, Canadian Celanese pfd and Imperial Bank firmed a point or more and fractions were added by Bell Telephone, Consolidated Bakeries, Massey-Harris, National Steel Car, Walkers common and Western Canada Flour while prices were a bit soft for the Abitibi issues, Canada Steamships pfd., Brewers and Distillers, Fanny Farmer and International Petroleum.

Kerr-Addison recovered the 10 cents lost on Friday, closing at 43 1/2 and minor gains were netted by other golds, including Brouhan, Preston, MacLeod-Cockshut, Senator, Royn and Chesterville, East Martie, Teck Hughes and Jason closed 2 to 3 cents down.

Falcon Bay improved 1-8 to 26 1-8 and Noranda had the same gain to 51 1-8. Steep Rock and Pond Orville posted minor losses and other issues held steady.

Highwood-Sarcee gained 2 cents to 282 and Anglo-Canadian held unchanged at 52.

WINNIPEG, June 15—(CP)—Confirmation of a good export business in Canadian flour and substantial southern purchases in the pit Saturday failed to lift the July wheat future from its peg on Winnipeg grain exchange. Offerings became more liberal as support improved and the July option held at 77 1/2 cents a bushel.

Coarse grain operations uncovered a little mill buying in oats, export support in barley and crusher interest in flax. Buenos Aires quotations remained unchanged.

CHICAGO, June 15—(AP)—Wheat prices Saturday slumped about two cents a bushel after an early attempt to rally on the basis of more rain in the southwestern belt where harvesting is being delayed.

Wheat closed 1 1/2-2 1/8 cents lower than yesterday, July \$1.00 1/4-1/8; Sept. \$1.01 7-8-3-4; corn unchanged to 3-8 off, July 73 1-8-1-4, Sept. 75-75 1-8; oats 1-4-3-8.

NEW YORK, June 15—(CP)—The Canadian dollar softened slightly in relation to United States currency last week, ending on the New York exchange at a discount of 11 13-16 cents compared with 11 5-8 at the end of the previous week. Saturday's opening at 12 1-8 was the same as Friday's close. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rates 9.08-9.21 per cent discount.)

The pound was stationary in both daily and weekly comparisons at \$4.03 3-4.
