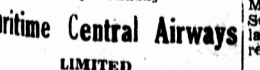

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. ANNIE CRASWELL WAITT Mrs. Annie Craswell Waitt died on April 20, 1943, at the age of 73 years at the home of her son Dr. Edworth P. Waite, Fernandina, Florida.

Mrs. Waitt was formerly Annie Craswell and was born in Rustico, P.E.I., on July 14, 1869, the daughter of Charles Craswell and Ann Bullman Craswell.

She lived in P.E.I. until about 28 years of age, when she moved to Boston, Boston and its vicinity were her home until 1900 when she married Charles H. Waitt of Boxborough, Massachusetts. Mrs. Waitt lived in Boxborough until just before her death, much beloved by all the people.

The deceased was a member of the Congregational Church of Boxborough and the local Grange. She was very active in church work.

Mrs. Waitt was a constant reader of The Guardian and subscribed to it for over forty years. She made many trips to P.E.I., the last being in 1939. She was always interested in the welfare of her friends and relatives on the Island.

Surviving are her husband Charles H. Waitt of Boxborough, Mass., two sons Dr. Edworth P. Waite of Fernandina, Florida, and Charles Waitt of Chelmsford, Mass., a brother Adam Craswell of South Rustico, and many other relatives in P.E.I. Three grandchildren also survive.

The funeral service was preached at 11 o'clock by Rev. Henry Oxnard, and interment was in the Lower Cemetery of that town.

U.S. Legation Quits Finland For Sweden

STOCKHOLM, April 23 (AP)—Most of the United States legation staff at Helsinki left the Finnish capital by plane for Stockholm suddenly today in what was seen by observers here as the beginning of a "war of nerves" to force the Finns to abandon the war on the side of the Axis.
