On the stairs several persons were trampled upon and injured. All those who jumped from the windows were injured, but none are expected to die. The building was burned to the ground with a loss of \$75,000.

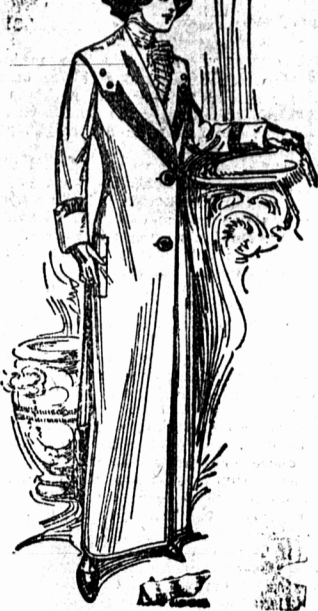

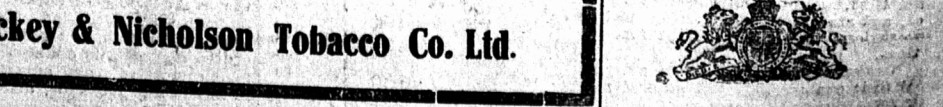
