Carnival next Tuesday.

Empress Lodge K. O. P. celebrates its natal day in Castle Hall this evening.

The annual meeting of the P. E. I. Dairy Association will be held at St. Peters today.

There was no crossing at the Capes yesterday. The special went to the Capes yesterday afternoon at 2.40 p. m.

The Stanley left Georgetown yesterday morning but was compelled to return after getting about three miles outside the harbor.

The brush work at the Railway Station is being continued and it is understood the work will be concluded at the present time.

The roads in the vicinity of Charlottetown are almost impassible and it is said that in some places travelling by team was impossible.

The Railway authorities report that the snow fighting on the P. E. Island Railway during the present winter has been the worst and of the longest duration in the history of the road.

The second Abegweit hockey team accompanied by six others went to Souris yesterday afternoon and played there last night. The score was 11 to 7 in favor of the Stars of Souris. George Nicholson of this city was referee.

Tomorrow Senator Wark of Fredericton N.B. will celebrate his 100th birthday. An extended account of Senator Wark who is the oldest parliamentarian in the world and his life work appeared in The Guardian about a year ago.

The trains were again greatly delayed and some cancelled yesterday on account of the storm. The eastern train yesterday morning was delayed two hours in coming to the city. The morning Tignish train did not get to Charlottetown till last night at 8.30. The train west yesterday morning only went as far as Summerside and no western train except the special to Cape Traverse went out in the afternoon.

AFTER digging all day at Crabbe's Corner, through the ice bound surface of the earth, the break in the 18 inch water main was discovered last night almost at the point where the digging was being done. This was the second hole that had been dug, the first having been begun at ten on Tuesday night and work was continued during the entire night and yesterday forenoon. It is hoped that the repairs to the pipe which is broken square off, evidently by an uneven bed, will be repaired and the water turned on to-day.
