New York World—If any woman in the world can boast more marriages, more children and more grandchildren than Mrs. Thekla Van Wyck, a widow who lives near Pretoria, South Africa, let her speak up for Mrs. Van Wyck claims the championship. She is now seventy-eight years old.

When not yet eighteen Miss Thekla de Been was married to Petrus Jacobson Lubbe, who dies a year later leaving her with one son.

Ten months after his death she was married to a widower with three children. She had borne him no children when he died and left her alone with the four little ones.

Five months later another widower asked and won her hand. He brought seven children by his first wife. Seven more children were born to them in the eleven years that passed before his death.

Three times widowed, she remained alone with the 18 children for five years.

Her fourth husband was another widower, this time with eight children. She bore him four more, so that when he died she was left with 38.

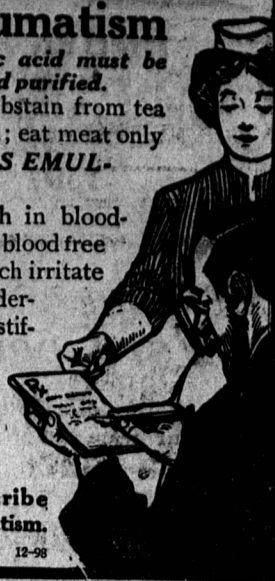
