QUICK FLIGHT WITH SERUM

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, June 28.—(By The Canadian Press)—A dramatic aeroplane-motor-car-train dash to save a sick child has ended successfully. Jojo, three-year old son of Mr. Elie Katz, a Cairo stockbroker, became ill on April 30. Specialists diagnosed the case as infantile paralysis of spinal origin on May 2, stating the only hope was to secure a special serum from Pasteur Institute, Paris, which must be applied within eight days of the commencement of the disease. Mr. Katz cabled to his brother in Paris and told him not to spare expense. The brother rushed to the Pasteur Institute at midnight, secured the serum and dispatched it by a special aeroplane which attempted to connect with the Imperial air liner at Vienna on May 4. WOMEN GREAT MONEY-MAKERS

SYDNEY, Australia, June 28.—(By The Canadian Press)—It looks as if the chief hospital Commissioner will have to commandeer some women to help him straighten out financial affairs in some of the big metropolitan hospitals. Said Dr. Cooper Booth, Commissioner for Venereal Diseases, in referring to the special clinic for this work: "At your clinic, women are receiving treatment as skilful as anywhere in the world, and as efficient as any of the great hospitals of Sydney. In addition, they receive kindness, sympathy, and prompt attention, impossible in a big hospital, where mixed cases are taken. I have tried, so far in vain, to establish a clinic for men, similar to yours."

LOOKING FOR BETTER COTTON

LONDON, June 28.—(By The Canadian Press)—Miss Ellen Wilkinson, M.P., wrote to the organizing secretary for National Cotton Week, held recently stating that she found it impossible to buy a cotton frock suitable for severe House of Commons wear. "I recognize that cotton hitherto has not been fashionable for that particular kind of wear, and that shops and manufacturers have to follow fashion. They are scarcely to blame," she remarked. AUSTRALIA'S WHEAT AREA EXCEEDS 17,000,000 ACRES

Australia devoted 12,276,086 acres to wheat and produced 118,199,775 bushels. The Commonwealth Statistician estimates the area under wheat cultivation in Australia exceeds 17,000,000 acres. Weather for the opening of the season has been favorable, and there are some expectations of a record yield. In 1927-28, the latest year for which official figures are available, Australia produced 118,199,775 bushels of wheat. Because of the labor shortage in Belgium, manufacturers are inducing Polish and Italian workers to immigrate there.
