track in 1900 has there been an event staged that will compare in interest with the coming meeting early in July at that track between Vansant 2:01 and Calumet Crusader 2:01 1/4 in a match race. It will be a great duel between two superb trotters of matchless speed and gameness.

Vansant is owned by Irvine Gleason who will be remembered through his campaigning of Peter Manning 1:56 3/4, holder of the world's trotting record, while Calumet Crusader is owned by E. Boland Harriman, one of the most enthusiastic backers of the harness horse industry and son of E. H. Harriman, the great railroad builder.

Two good pacers were recently shipped from Maine to Sydney, C.E. namely, Quaker Girl (3) 2:13 1/2, by Peter Volo an own sister to Call Moyer 2:07 1/2, and Independence Girl by Diamond Q. 2:07 1/4 out of the old "A" shares. Old shares of Alcohol had been expected to rise following decision at a special meeting yesterday to return to shareholders all capital not used for production but this expedition failed to materialize. The "A" lost 3-4 at 14-1 and the "B" 5-8 at 13-7-8.

Newsprint issues lay more or less in the background today after occupying the centre of the stage for the past several sessions. Paper stocks have attracted considerable attention of late, on reports of the growing consumption of newsprint and indication of an improving outlook for the industry. St. Lawrence Corporation showed a small gain and others were traded in odd lots for the most part.

Among the leaders Consolidated Smelters was a strong feature, raising 3 points to a closing figure of 108. International Nickel showed a small gain while Shawinigan was also fractionally higher. Dominion Bridge rose 3-4 at 34 3/4 and Dominion Coal Preferred 2 at 27 while gains ranging up to close to 2 points were shown by Canadian Celanese, Canada Rosebush Preferred, Brazilian and others. B. C. Power, Celanese Preferred, Canadian Pacific and others displayed narrow fractional declines.
