WHO OWNS LABRADOR?

(From the Vancouver Sun.) Few people in this Province are aware that there has been for many years a boundary dispute between the Dominion of Canada and Newfoundland. The matter, however, after having lain dormant for a century has suddenly become acute. The difference of opinion concerns the coast of Labrador, which extends to Newfoundland, and the point of issue is as to how far the coast extends inland. What has brought the matter up at this time is the extension of the boundaries of Quebec so as to include Ungava. The Province of Quebec is now claiming rights over the timber limits and other revenue-producing assets of the whole region. To this claim Newfoundland demurs vigorously. The interesting feature lies in the fact that the decision is to be left to the privy council. Memory does not recall another instance of a lawsuit between two of the overseas dominions of the Empire. If the privy council were not available, it is difficult to see how any settlement could ever be reached except by an appeal to the British Empire is therefore furnishing the world with a working model of an international tribunal. There is really no reason why a court of law should not decide between Germany and France, just as well as between Canada and Newfoundland. But the day when this will occur is probably still far off.
