Active Session On New York Stock Market

By Frank MacMillan, Associated Press Financial Writer (By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—In the most active session since July 26, 1934 the stock market pushed upstream today through cross currents of profit-taking.

Shares met the heaviest selling during the first hour as blocks of several thousands changed hands leaving the ticker tape two minutes behind floor trading. The ability of the market to withstand the shock of liquidation provided encouragement, brokers said, and subsequent demand drove a number of issues up to new highs for 1935. Several issues rose 1 to 5 points.

(C. F. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, Oct. 15.—Wide open trading marked the opening of Montreal Stock Exchange today, with shortly after noon today and volume failed to pass the 13,000 shares mark.

With tension which has held them in check for the past few weeks lifted on completion of the Dominion elections, traders were inclined to deal freely at the start and tickers raced to catch up with sales.

Banks hold the spotlight in heavy turnover. Bank of Commerce was up 6 1/2 points at 149 and Bank of Montreal rose 6 to 180 while Royal Bank fell 1/2 point to 194. The sole loss in the group was shown by Bank of Canada, down two at 52 following the sweeping return of the Liberal party to power.

Consolidated Smelters was one of the main market features with an advance of 5 points to 182 1/2, close to the high for the year established last spring. Canada Cement Preferred rose 2 at 55 and Montreal Power 3/4 at 32 1/2.
