

The Easter Festival receives due attention from our chorists. Choirs have been steadily at work for some time and church as well as non church adherents may look forward to the bright hopeful Easter-tide with a high musical anticipation. The First Methodist choir make a point to give one of the larger choruses from the oratorios at each Festival. "The Heavens are Telling" from Haydn's creation is this Easter's selection. In honor of its being the Knights' Templars votive Saint's day "The Crusaders March" will be sung. This is from Henry Hills' oratorio "The Crusaders"—a magnificent chorus with brilliant obligato accompaniment. Schillings Easter Anthem furnishes an opportunity for quartet and chorus work, the lighter concerted being an admirable foil to the heavy chorus work as in "The Heavens are Telling." Particular local interest will attach to the canticle on this occasion as it is the composition of the Revd. Geo. E. Foster, M. A. of Springhill. It is a setting of the twenty third psalm in part in anthem, part in chant form. Melodic and simple it is, admirably adapted for amateur choirs. Mr. Foster has caught the spirit of this lyric so full of faith in the "Res" that Remaneth—the horrible darkness prefatory to the effulgence of glory—but through that darkness "He is with us." The anthem merits popularity; nicely harmonised and when requisite with a jubilant rhythm that carries one to conviction. Easter carols and the quartet "Grandeur than Ocean's Story" furnish a festival program as generous in scope as those offered in our sister metropoliti.

SEALERS AMONG THE HERDS.
St. John's Nfld, March 24.—Thirteen of the twenty sealing steamers operating off Labrador were sighted to-day near the coast, apparently among the seal herds. One two-masted ship left the fleet and steamed to the south, presumably loaded and homeward bound. The fierce snowstorms raging during the past week have had a serious effect on the work of the sealers.

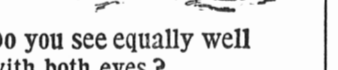
