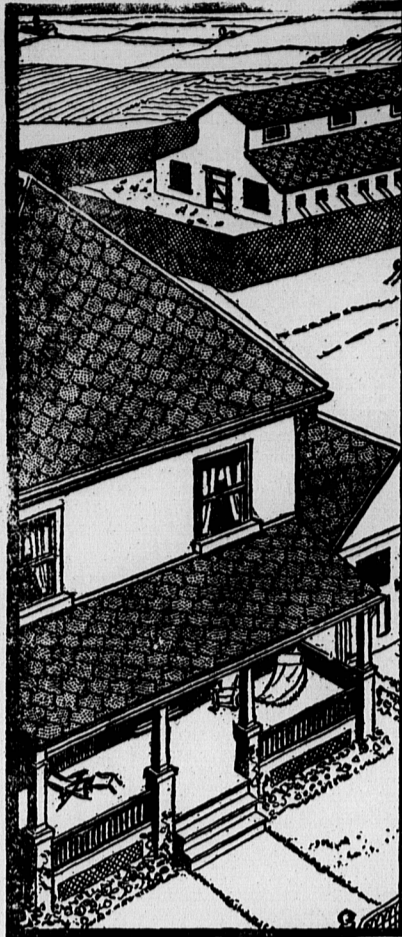

Robinson's Mill at the east end of the town. The young fellow was working at the Bakery adjoining the mill and was returning from dinner when, he says, that he saw smoke coming from one of the tanks and went over to look at it. He struck the side of the tank and the gas at once ignited, burning the little lad's face and hand. He was able to run to his home but fainted immediately after. He was taken to the hospital where his burns were dressed and allowed afterwards to go home. On Tuesday morning he was suffering a good deal, but the doctors are in hopes that his eye-sight is uninjured. Much sympathy is expressed for the young boy, who is a general favorite.—S.

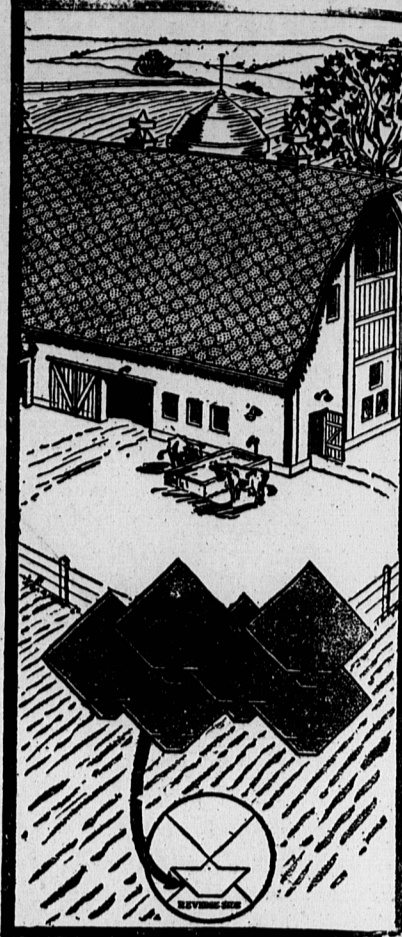

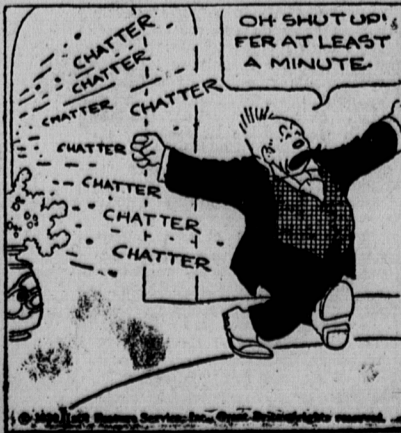
