THE MONUMENT.

In the fine monument to be unveiled on Queen's Square this afternoon our citizens and visitors will view the realization of a public enterprise which was set on foot nearly three years ago.

"It seems fitting that some permanent memorial should be erected to signalize our recognition of those who, as representatives of Prince Edward Island, bore a manly part in the great struggle, and especially of those who have fallen, that their names may be preserved and venerated in the years to come.

"We have as yet no public monuments in Charlottetown. Those of our readers who have visited St. John may have seen there the splendid monument erected some years ago on the principal square in front of the Court House at a cost of thousands of dollars to Frederick Young of Charlottetown who perished in a brave effort to save another from drowning.

"Such a monument, standing ever in view of the living in our most populous centre, will do honor to all who fought and endured, whether they survived or fell. Those who gaze upon it in our day or in future ages will recall the splendid achievements of the Canadian Contingent in the hard conflict at Paardeberg, in the long and arduous marches, the well-earned endurance that marked their progress from De Aar to Pretoria.

The response was immediate from different sections of town and country, showing that the appeal had touched a popular chord. After a time a citizens' meeting was called, and a strong committee appointed who have given zealous and arduous effort to carry forward the work to the final success which has been now achieved.

the ability and skill with which he performed his arduous voluntary work in connection with the many meetings of the committee, the securing of proposals and designs from various sculptors, the arrangement of multifarious details down to date, were beyond all praise.

It must be gratifying to all patriotic citizens and especially to the generous donors to the Monument Fund as it is to The Guardian, that the Monument is to be unveiled today. As an artistic work it will speak for itself and we believe it will enhance the already high reputation of the sculptor, Mr. Hamilton McCarthy. It is, we believe, all that three years ago The Guardian asked that it should be, a fitting permanent memorial of Island valor, patriotism and worth.
