Canadian government to pull down our barriers against the whole world, especially against the United States, which borders us for a distance of three or four thousand miles, and with a population of 110 millions?

Mr. McIsaac ably refuted among other things the charge made by Mr. Hughes relative to Col. Jenkins so-called statement regarding fraudulent manipulation of soldiers' ballots and advised Mr. Hughes to stick closer to the political issues under discussion. He concluded his address amid enthusiastic applause.

Mr. D. J. Mullin, the next speaker was also warmly applauded. He maintained that to put out a Conservative government and put in its place a Liberal government is practically the same thing. He believed it was a hard proposition to put reciprocity again with the United States, whichever party was returned, but voiced the conviction that a Farmers' government would most successfully forward this end. Mr. Hughes, he said, had been in parliament for quite a number of years as a Liberal and during his term had accomplished nothing worth while. The Liberals, in fact, were in power fifteen years and accomplished practically nothing except the Reciprocity Treaty with the States. (Laughter.) The speaker wished to make no definite charge regarding this treaty, but there was an election peaking at the time and it looked very much like a cooked up affair. He maintained that the candidates of the two older political parties were at the bidding of the "party machine" and the time had come for the people to shake off party prejudices and come to the support of the Farmers' party. Mr. Crerar has been charged with getting a big salary, but any man at the head of a company numbering 36,000 members and doing \$25,000,000 business regarding this treaty, but there was an election peaking at the time and it looked very much like a cooked up affair. He maintained that the candidates of the two older political parties were at the bidding of the "party machine" and the time had come for the people to shake off party prejudices and come to the support of the Farmers' party.
