A RECENT addition to the list of the faculty of the Manitoba Medical College is the name of Dr. S. W. Prowse. Dr. Prowse is an Islander, the youngest son of Hon. Senator Prowse. Allison, Mr. Prowse immediately began the study of medicine in the University of Edinburgh, where, after a more than ordinary distinguished record, he obtained the university degree of bachelor of medicine and master in surgery. After graduation Dr. Prowse soon entered upon the practice of his profession in Pifeshire town. Four or five years later he resigned general practice and after taking the post graduate degree of M. D. from the University of Edinburgh; proceeded to London, where he pursued the study of his present specialties, diseases of eye, ear, nose and throat. In 1893 Dr. Prowse was after examination elected a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, and in the same year commenced practice as a specialist in the city of Winnipeg.—St. John Star.
