NEW YORK, Aug. 15—(AP)—Topping off a day of surprise packages in both betting and racing, Mrs. Barclay Douglas yesterday "borrowed back" a colt she sold a few weeks ago for \$5,000 and with it won the 74th running of the Travers Stakes, the oldest horse race in the United States. Her \$15,280-for-42 shot, Eurastian, pulled a rabbit out of the hat for the entertainment of a crowd of 28,244 who sat in on the transplanted Saratoga-at-Belmont session, after Bee Mac, a gift to Beatrice Macguire of New York from Col. Ed. Bradley last year came walking in with the 52nd running of the six furlong Spine-away Stakes for two-year-old fillies.

New Forward Pass Rule For Hockey Adopted

TORONTO, Aug. 15 — (CP)—A new rule which permits a player of the defending team to make forward passes as far as centre ice without an offside being called was the feature of a two-day joint rules meeting of the National Hockey League and the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association which concluded here today. The rule, adopted at Saturday's meeting provides for a new red line two inches wide across the rink at centre ice called the "centre line" to distinguish the new zone. Officials hoped the rule would result in a faster game and check the trend toward power plays evidenced in recent years.
