AKRON, Ohio, Jan. 15—John Williams, 45 years old, an employee of the Oliver Sands Company, was shot and killed last night at Warwick, a village south of this town, in a quarrel with Bert Pettl, the foreman of the same concern. The quarrel is said to have arisen over the merits of a machine invented by Adams, and for a time used under Pettl's direction but later discarded. The police rescued Pettl from an angry crowd that had gathered, and brought him to the jail here. Williams leaves a widow and three children.

SASKATOON, Sask. Jan. 15—A woman and four children were burned to death here in a fire that destroyed the dwelling of a homesteader named Henderson. Alex. Reid, father of two of the children was badly burned and will die.

Reid's children boarded with Henderson and the two men had been out ranching and only returned for a few days, yesterday. The blaze broke out while the family were asleep, from an unknown cause.

SOME ISLANDERS ABROAD

Dear Sir,—On the 20th of march last I took the train at Charlottetown for Georgetown, crossing next day to Picou, thence to the Canadian West, arriving in Daysand, Colorado, on the 29th, where I took a position in the store of B. R. Matthews. He is doing a rushing business, employing at the present time four clerks. During the month of September I was offered a position with the firm of Murphy, Ready Co. of Fort Collins, Colorado, which I accepted, coming here Nov. 1st.

The Murphy Ready Co are both P. E. I. boys and have many friends in the fair Province down by the sea. They both came to the American West 19 years ago and after a brief stay in the town of Rawlins, Wyoming, decided to start business and bought a business block which they own at the present time. Four years ago they opened a branch store in the town of Fort Collins, Colorado. This store is managed by Mr. Murphy while the one in Rawlins, Wyoming, is managed by Mr. Ready.

And here let me say that no firm in Wyoming or Colorado is more favorably known than the firm of Murphy Ready Co. "Successful Islanders abroad," will certainly apply in this case.

The town of Fort Collins is about 70 miles west of Denver and is reached by the Colorado and Southern R. R.

It has a population of upwards of 12,000 and is an up-to-date town with all the modern conveniences. The Union Pacific is also building a branch line into this town. The backbone of the town is the farming industry. With a good system of irrigation they raise large quantities of sugar beets and Alfalfa and reap a good profit. We have a sugar refinery which is operated by the Great Western Sugar Co. They employ about 500 hands and run about four months each year.

This town is an ideal one, with an abundance of trees and a park that a larger city might be proud of. The altitude is 4,000 feet. We have the State Agricultural College here, the average attendance being about 400. There are ten Indians taking a short course at present. This town like Greeley and Longmont has a prohibitory liquor law which is the boast and pride of all good citizens. Denver is also trying to get prohibition, although the drinking cost the people of Denver on New Years Eve \$20,000. Still they claim out of a population of 235,000 they have a majority in favor of prohibition. I remain,

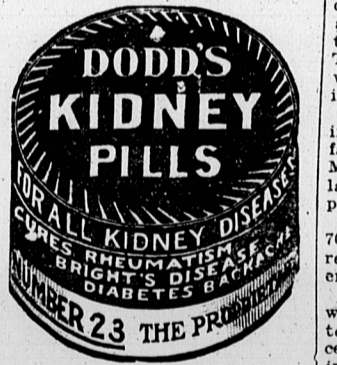
