Overseas Closeups
 (By The Canadian Press)
WITH THE CANADIAN FORCES OVERSEAS, May 6 - (CP)
 -Aurich, Germany, formation scene of the first Canadian Rifle Brigade in Army history, was also the scene of its break-up when the Royal Winnipeg Rifles departed for Canada to retrain.
 To mark the occasion, the brigade marched past the commander, Lt. Col. J. N. Medhurst of Toronto, Royal Winnipeg Rifles were preceded by the Queen's Own Rifles and Regina Rifles, both of whom later lined the roadside to bid farewell to the departing regiment.
 Canadian Graves Registration Units, responsible for locating, identifying and proper burying of Canadian casualties in the European conflict, are still at work one year after the war's end.
 Moving through areas where Canadian servicemen have been known to fall, the units - employing the help of local governments, clergy officials, radio stations and newspapers - are searching for 500 war dead not yet accounted for.
 At their own expense, Canadian servicemen stationed in the occupation zone of Germany now can ship their dogs to Canada. Cost of transportation varies with the rank of the owners.
 In St. Peter's Church, Oldenburg, Germany, recently, Pte. M. Larler, Charlottetown, P. E. I., married Bdr. Paul Drescher, Jamesstown, N. Y. Nuptial mass was conducted by Hon. Capt. F. D. Galbraith and the bride was given away by Capt. R. S. C. Williams.
 Addressing a final gathering of Auxiliary Services personnel at Varel, Germany, recently, Maj. Gen. Chris Vokes, G. O. C. of the Canadian Occupation Force, said work of the four Canadian Voluntary Organizations have been the greatest factors for the morale of the Canadian servicemen here.
 The general suggested that without the Canadian Legion, Salvation Army, Knights of Columbus and the Y. M. C. A. there might have been some trouble.
 "Thanks to your efforts in providing extra food, entertainment, sports programs, and other amenities, C. A. O. F. has been well behaved and well cared for," he concluded.
 When two of the "Brockville Rockettes" C. A. O. F. dance-band were ordered by a visiting doctor, following their insistence on continuing their current engagement at Berlin City, Oldenburg, Germany, the R. C. A.
