

DUNDAS and Vicinity—The snow has disappeared to a considerable extent during the past week, and the bridges and some high places on the roads are now bare, causing parties hauling large loads considerable annoyance. The scho Morning Light is undergoing repairs at Bridge-town and her owner, Capt Richards, expects to have her finished by the time navigation opens. It seems strange that in this province, once the scene of such large ship building industries, there are not more vessels owned by the different firms engaged in the shipping trade. Our coast waters team with cod, hake, and herring, for which many vessels from Nova Scotia come to our waters to engage in fishing every season, and many of them go homeward bound with a full fare. It seems that the development of our fisheries is something that might profitably receive more attention from the Tribunes in our Provincial Senate Chamber. It appears to the writer that a great mistake was made in placing the control of our fisheries in the hands of the Federal Government at Confederation. The freshets caused by the late soft weather have given our mill owners a full supply of water to drive their machinery, and as most of the farmers in this section have been more careful of their forest lands than have the people in other sections of P. E. Island, our saw mills have plenty to do all winter and mostly all summer. The good ice on the Grand River during the last few days has caused a great many of our young men, who have fast horses, to spend the evenings on the river training up for record smashing. —Election day passed off quietly here, although it was evident that some men who should be setting a better example to the growing generation, had a little more enthusiasm than cold water or tea would account for. These men certainly do not realize what a glorious privilege they enjoy when they have a right to a voice in the Government of their country. If they studied the history of the fight for the Franchise they would then perhaps realize better that their right to vote has cost too much blood, and too many noble lives, and is too sacred to be bartered for a bottle of rotten whiskey.

At present fourteen houses are quarantined, and there are twenty-six cases nearly all of which are at the infectious disease hospital.
