**LOST TREASURES.**  
 Many of the great treasures of the world's literature have totally disappeared. Even so late as 1852 a copy of Canterbury Tales, valued, it is said at £500, was used to light the fire in a London church; while Carlyle's first manuscript of the French Revolution, which he left to his friend, John Stuart Mill, to read, was accidentally destroyed by fire while in the latter's possession, and Carlyle heroically started the work all over again, although he stated that the second effort was not a patch on the first.

During the French Revolution an exceedingly valuable copy of The Golden Legend was used to light a librarian's fire. In 1802 a servant of Warburton, used several dramas of Chapman, Greene, and Massinger to clean shoes and light fires. After the death of Pierece there was found in his apartments a huge chest filled with letters from the most eminent scholars of the time.

The collection was of immense literary and historic value. His niece, instead of complying with repeated requests to have them published, used them for fuel, in order to diminish the expense of firewood.—T. P.'s Weekly.

**AN ABLE WOMAN.**

Miss Julia C. Lathrop has recently been placed at the head of the children's bureau in Washington. The work of this department is to collect information concerning the children of the country in order that the conditions under which they are growing up may be improved. It is 22 years since Miss Lathrop, then a Vassar graduate, went to Chicago to associate herself with Miss Jane Addams in her work at Hull House. How her work has commended itself to the older woman is shown by Miss Addams' testimony that she is fitted for her office by "executive ability, sympathy, deliberate and sane judgment, combined with years of experience." While working among the girls at Hull House, Miss Lathrop succeeded in gaining the co-operation both of the citizens and the officials of the government. It is not singular that her attention of one whose work lay among the poor and the vicious should have had her attention directed to the need of a better understanding of the treatment of the insane. Miss Lathrop organized the Illinois society for mental hygiene, of which she has been made president. It is, however, as a teacher that this great woman is said to be best known. She is vice-president of the Chicago school of civics and philanthropy, and in her position as instructor has done much in the preparation of men and women, who are now engaged in social and civic work. Miss Lathrop's success in the high office to which she has been called is a matter of not only national but of continental importance. That the youth of the United States shall be helped to grow up healthy and virtuous concerns Canada as well as her neighbor. It is worthy of note that such women as Julia C. Lathrop and Jane Addams have been enabled to serve their city and their country without the possession of the ballot. There are thousands of men who have voted at every election who have not done a tithe of the good that they and such as they have accomplished. This is an argument that cuts both ways, but it shows that the women are not wise who become so absorbed in their desire for the possession of the ballot that they neglect the duties that lie at their door.

**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.**  
 ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must reside in person at the Dominion lands Agency or Subagency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made in certain cases, by certain relations by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the intending homesteader.  
 Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.  
 In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section along with his homestead. Price \$200 per acre.  
 Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to carry homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.  
 A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead rights cannot obtain pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre.  
 Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$2000.
