FEWER DEATH THAN FORMERLY.

FREDERICTON, Nov. 1.—The Board of Health figures for the year ended Oct. 31 show a total of 123 deaths in Fredericton, including fourteen non-residents. This is said to be a lower death rate here than in fourteen years. There were no deaths from contagious diseases, but those from tuberculosis showed a slight increase.

Since the inauguration of the water filtration plant several years ago, typhoid fever has been stamped out here.

THE SANDJAK OF NOVBIAZAR.

(New York Herald.)
The Sandjak of Novibazar, though only 4,800 square miles in extent, and having a population of only 174,000 persons, is of vast strategical importance, for it is the extreme north-western part of Turkey in Europe, forming a wedge of Ottoman territory between Serbia and Montenegro, and is on the direct route from Austria to the Aegean Sea. If it fell into the power of Serbia and Montenegro it would effectually bar Austria's further expansion southward. By the Treaty of Berlin Austria was permitted to keep several garrisons in the Sandjak, but the civil administration remained in the hands of Turkey. Of the population about three-fourths are Christian Serbs. Novibazar, the capital has a population of twelve thousand persons.
