Montreal Stock Market Showed Advance Monday

MONTREAL, Dec. 16—(CP)—Faced by a number of leaders securities moved up on average today in transactions on the stock exchange and curb market. Gains were well ahead of losses and in the indices banks, utilities, industrials and papers were higher and goods were lower.

Quebec Pulp Preferred was featured in papers, jumping 2 1-2. Lawrence Paper Preferred firmed 2. Better fractionally to around a point were Brown Preferred and Common, Consolidated, Great Lakes and Fraser, Eastern were Dryden and Abitibi issues. Harder among industrials were Massey, Locomotive, Foundries, Moore, Nuclear, Asbestos, Caron issues. Cocksbutt, Tar, Dredge, B. C. Paper, Gypsum and C. Industries. Softer were N. S. Car. C. Car. I. Bronze Preferred, D. Bridge, D. Woolens, Algoma, U. Steel, D. Engineering, Fairchild and Ford. Celanese was up and D. Textiles down in their section. Walker, Seagrams, N. Breweries and Alco "B" pushed up in beverages and Alco "A" slipped.

Better utilities were B. C. Power "A" which converted a loss into an increase. B. C. Shawinigan, Brazilian and Quebec Power. Power Corporation and Twin City backed up. Montreal and Royal were improved in banks and Commerce was shaded. In metals, Noranda switched from loss to vinterrain and also higher were Nickel, Aluminum, Smelters and H. B. Mining. Hollinger retreated in goods. Petroleum advanced in refiners and McGill firmed. E. Sullivan and Sullivan extended last week's gains in junior mines and others in front were Donalds, after opening low. C. Cadillac, Eldona, Reva and Bond Ore. Porcupine tumbled.

Winners in miscellaneous were Ogilvie, Lewis, Auto Fabrics "B" and Paul, Southam, St. Lawrence Flour and Argus weakened.

Prices Up Slightly On N. Y. Exchange

NEW YORK, Dec. 16—(AP)—Buyers took on modest amounts of special stocks, including building issues, in today's market while many neglected leaders drifted to lower territory.

A few "thin" stocks showed advances of around 3 points at the close but fractional irregularity was the rule.

Associated Press 60-stock average was up 1 of point at 66. Gains and losses were about evenly divided in the Canadian group. Canadian Pacific and Dome stock gained 1-8. Hiram Walker was 1-4 and Distillers Seagrams 1-8. Lake Shore, on the curb, eased 1-8.

Allied Chemical added 3 1-2 points at 170 1-2. Eastman Kodak 3 at 224. U. S. Gypsum 1 1-8 at 105. Southern Railway 1-2. Others: 3-8 and Thompson-Starrett 3-4 at 6 7-8. Ahead were American Radiator, Celotex, Certain-Teed, International Harvester, Douglas Aircraft, American Can, Texas Co., Union Carbide and Consolidated Edison.

Bethlehem Steel yielded 1 1-4 at 91 3-4. International Telephone 1-8 at 118. Chrysler 1 at 88 1-2. Du Pont 1 1-2 at 186 1-2. Others: losers were U. S. Steel, General Motors, U. S.
