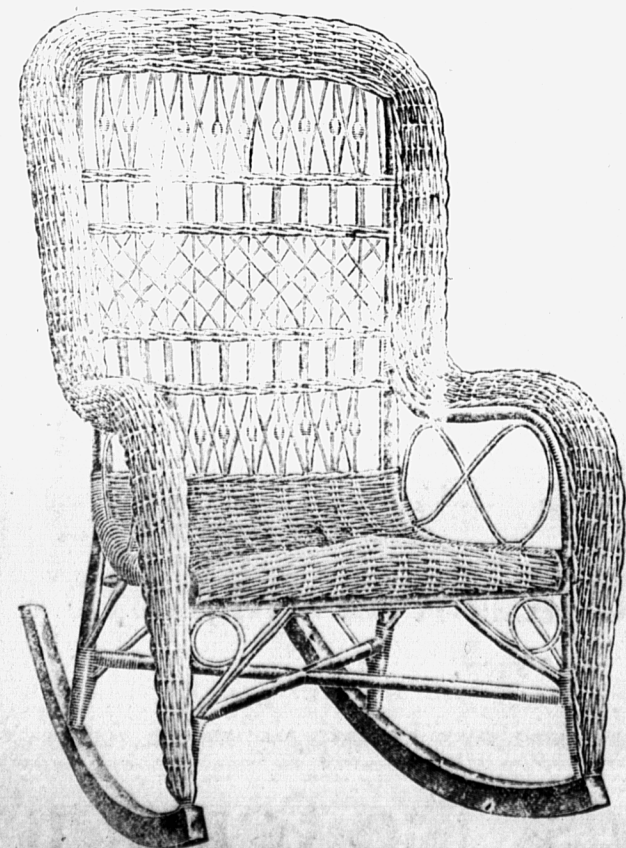

PRIDE IN OUR CAPITAL CITY.

The return to Charlottetown, this summer of a number of former residents who had been away for long periods, and who expressed their surprise and pleasure at the change in the city during their absence, has perhaps done more than anything else to turn the attention of the people of Charlottetown upon themselves and to induce a commendable civic pride, the effect of which is plainly noticeable—particularly during the past two years.

Certainly by those returned sojourners from abroad a great difference will be noted in the appearance of Charlottetown. The prominent landmarks of their days have been obliterated or displaced by finer buildings. Take, for instance, St. Dunstan's Cathedral, St. Paul's Church, Prince of Wales College, the City Market Building, the City Hall, the Prince Edward Island and the Charlottetown Hospital, the transformed Drillshed, and the Exhibition Buildings. These public buildings have completely changed the picture which dwelt in the minds of those long absent from their native Isle. Then the improvements in Queen Square Gardens, on the streets and sidewalks, the trees planted, the fences removed, the neatly kept grounds and the general painting and cleaning up of houses has resulted in producing a city of the most creditable appearance.

Perhaps just here we should pause and enquire if, after all, a good deal of this improvement is not traceable to the introduction of waterworks and sewerage. Certainly it looks as if the era of improvement had a beginning about that time, and it may be taken to be beyond all question that none can now be found to seriously say this City could dispense with one or the other.

It is a pleasure to note this growth of civic interest, this growth among citizens of a personal pride in their city, their desire to have it well spoken of and admired, and their determination that it shall continue to merit a high reputation. Already—and this has only been brought about in the last few years—Charlottetown and the whole Province has been well advertised and become favorably known to the world over. This has been done largely through the disinterested efforts of citizens aided by the sympathy and co-operation of the local Government and the Charlottetown City Council, and by the efforts thus put forth the attractions of this Province have become widely known.

For the improved streets and sidewalks of late years the City Council are deserving of all credit. But those to whom the greatest need of praise is due are the citizens—property holders, who during late years have, when they built houses,

built handsome houses, who have beautified their grounds, who take a pride in making their property look creditable. Those who have planted trees and lawns, who have striven to introduce improvements, who have worked to abolish nuisances, come all within the category. If they have not succeeded in doing all they planned they should not lose heart, for sooner or later all their desire shall be accomplished. Even the County Jail will sometime or other be moved outside of the City limits.

It is hardly necessary to point out wherein is most noticeable the progress we are speaking of. Apart from the public buildings already alluded to consider the many residences which have been erected at Brighton, now one of the Charlottetown's most beautiful suburbs. Years ago Black Sam's Bridge designated a boundary line, to go beyond which was to have one's nostrils assailed by the odour of a particularly active tannery, and one's eyes wearied by the spectacle of a monotonous row of plank on one side by the "Governor's Woods." Today no city of Canada can boast a more desirable residential quarter. Then take the fine houses built on West Street on Richmond Street, around Hillborough Square. Take The Victoria—inside and out worthy of a greater City than ours—the proprietor of which at his own expense rented and made respectable a vacant lot which was an eyesore before the front of his hotel. Take also the enlarged and improved Queen Hotel. All over houses have been going up, for a lot of building has been done. To the citizens who have done these things belongs in large measure the credit for making Charlottetown the admiration of strangers and a surprise to its former citizens.

We are not in a position to boast of superiority. But a consideration of these facts shows that Charlottetown is progressing satisfactorily; that it is a pleasant place to dwell in and full of promise for the future.

Of the older Charlottetown much that was quaintly picturesque has, we grant, passed away with the march of the years. But this is an age of improvement, of greater convenience, and pleasure and comfort, of wider range of activity—notwithstanding the regretful plaints and stories we sometimes hear of the "good old days."
