grain and harness shops, and levy a regular blackmail of the coachmen in Naples. Their connection with politicians and others in positions of considerable importance, secures their immunity, as was shown by the fact that Captain Fabbri was hampered in his investigations by the police. The protection afforded to the gang was so bare-faced that soon after Captain Fabbri's arrival, several lawyers, themselves members of the Camorra, started a paper in which they made repeated attacks upon him and upon the methods he employed. The openness of their procedure is, indeed, one of the most remarkable facts about the organization. It was shown strikingly by the act that led to the whole inquiry. A certain Cucolo, a taxista, or one of those who plan robberies for the others to execute, began giving information about some of his fellows, and at a meeting of the gang, at which the present head, Ricconi presided, it was arranged that they decided that he and his wife must be put to death. To celebrate the occasion they held a banquet, and it was while they were holding this that the news was brought to them that the double murder had been successfully accomplished.

The strength of their organization is shown in many ways. Those of their members who are in prison levy blackmail on the other prisoners, and death is the price of a refusal to submit to their demands. Robbery and crime generally are kept strict to members of the gang and the outsiders who encroach on the very soon get out of the way. A crime of violence is demanded as the price of admission, and it is this that is a cause of the many senseless, objectless murders for which Naples is notorious. At times, too, they congregate for collective duels; the captains of two parties start quarrelling, their followers support their several principals, and a number are usually killed. Another sign of the disregard they show for society is the annual pilgrimage they make to Monte Virgine, a place about four days' journey from Naples. They travel in cars, gaily decorated with ribbons and bells, and no one interferes with them, though their identity is well known. The issue of the present trial is still doubtful. The accused were five years in prison before the case ever came into court, and it is very doubtful after all this time whether it will be possible to get sufficient evidence for a conviction. But the Camorra is an institution from which Italy

 "A calf with two heads is a freak of nature that one seldom sees but such may be seen at the barn of Plus McPhee, Souris Line Road. This two faced calf was dropped on Saturday the 18th and is still living and seems to be just as well as an ordinary calf. Scores of people are visiting the barn daily to have a look at this natural curiosity.

 "The news was received in Souris yesterday by Mr. Charles Acorn of the death of her brother Charles H. Sabine, West Point, which occurred on Sunday the 19th, in his 64th year. The deceased was the youngest son of the late Henry Sabine of Sturgeon and his wife Martha (McCurry) who in the early part of last century was a Methodist preacher of some note. Although Mr. Sabine had been in poor health for some time his death was unexpected and came as a great shock to his many friends here. He leaves to mourn his wife and two sons, Jago and Theo. and three daughters: Stella and Eva at home and Annie in California, also one brother William H. in California and two sisters: Mrs. Charles Acorn, Souris, and Mrs. S. H. Rogers, Bath, Maine, besides numerous relatives in this Province and other places to mourn their loss.
 "The present trial is encouraging as showing that the government, which directly intervened to support Captain Fabbri, has evidently realized that it is time to take effective steps to suppress what really amounts to a petty state that thinks nothing of setting the government at defiance to gain its violent ends.
 "Mrs. C. D. Weeks, city, has received a telegram announcing the death of her sister, Mrs. Dr. McNeill, aged 23. The deceased had been ill for the past three weeks with typhoid fever. Her maiden was Miss Nona Croft. She leaves a husband, one brother, and two sisters to mourn. Mrs. McNeill, spent part of the summer of 1910 on the island, and frequently visited here, prior to her marriage.

THE FOLLOWING WAS INADEQUATELY OMITTED FROM YESTERDAY'S ISSUE.
 SCRAPTON, Pa., Nov. 15.—William Peter Bisbie, 21 years old of Kingslon, Pa., discharged Thursday from the United States Express Service was arrested this morning for murder of express manager Irwin G. Borden on the Lackawanna Railroad between Taylor and this city last night. Bisbie confessed to the killing. He was riding in the car with Borden's permission.
 Borden was seen by the train hands at work in the car during the minute that the train was stopped at Taylor. When the train arrived at the Beranton station four minutes later Borden was lying dead in a pool of blood on the floor of the car with his head battered in. Between \$1,500 and \$2,000 is missing.

ROME, Nov. 18.—The sensational opening of the Camorra trial and the length of the yet unfinished proceedings, have aroused in the public a sense of the interest and the importance attaching to the subject of secret organizations in Southern Italy. Different from the Mafia, which refers to a mode of life rather than to an organization, the Camorra is a secret society, deriving its ritual from Spain, and having taken its rules direct from those of an association of thieves which flourished at Toledo in the fifteenth century. It was imported into Naples at the time of the Spanish occupation, and has flourished since then as a smuggling, black-mailing, and thieving organization. The mystery as to how it has been able to achieve its present strength is partly explained by the fact that in 1860 several of its members were enrolled in the police force, and in this connection it is significant to notice that the arrests in the case of the present trial were made not by the police, but by Captain Fabbri, a captain of the "gendarmerie," who came to Naples with a well-established reputation won in Sicily. The members of the Camorra for the most part belong to the lower middle class. Large numbers of them keep
