Dr. Hughes, house surgeon at the hospital, refused the young man admission, saying that the condition of the young woman was so serious that nobody could see her.

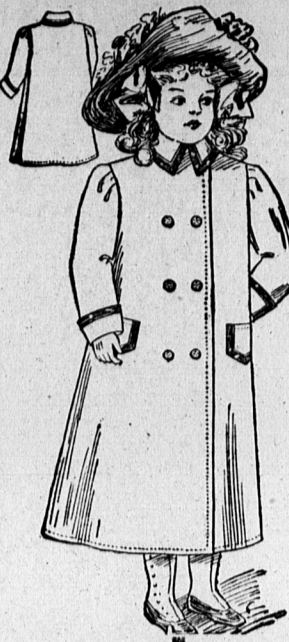
