The most crying need of literature at the present time, it sometimes appears to us is for a man without a mission. A very wholesome reaction against the "art for art's sake" business, as pursued by decadent extremists, has been caught up in another direction, so that now nearly everybody who has a gift for writing interestingly finds it necessary to search around for some message to deliver or some cause to champion, as though it were fruitless to write at all unless there were a sermon to be preached.

The message may be noble and the cause deserving, and as a matter of fact they generally are; but to the point is that the reading public is becoming just a little tired of both messages and causes. It is perfectly willing to be harrowed up to a certain point, and it realizes that a proper sympathy with other people's troubles is a desirable quality. But it wants a holiday now and then, and would be genuinely relieved if, every once in a while, it were allowed to regard the word as a fairly tolerable place after all, and not quite as bad as it is generally depicted.

We have more than once made suggestions for the foundation of various new societies, and so far as we are aware, none of our suggestions have met with the response they deserve. Nevertheless nothing daunted we will try again with a Society for the Reformation of Gifted Writers. The object of the society would be to start a sort of Keely cure for authors afflicted with an indigestion. CHINA'S MAGNA CHARTA.

Below is given the combined Magna Charta and Bill of Rights recently wrung from the imperial power in China by the Army League and the National Assembly. Concessions obtained in other lands only after centuries of strife were wrung from the Dragon Throne in six days. The people of China are thus to be given a larger voice in the government than in any other nation existing under the monarchical form. The Charter which is to be the basis of the new constitution of China, is based upon the British model, but in several respects goes further in the direction of democracy and in limiting the power of the Crown:—

1. The Ta-ching Dynasty shall reign for ever.
2. The person of the Emperor shall be inviolable.
3. The power of the Emperor shall be limited by a Constitution.
4. The order of the successions shall be prescribed in the Constitution.
5. The Constitution shall be drawn up and adopted by the Tze-cheng-yuan and promulgated by the Emperor.
6. The power of amending the Constitution belongs to Parliament.
7. The members of the Upper House shall be elected by the people from among those particularly eligible for the position.
8. Parliament shall elect and the Emperor shall appoint the Premier, who will recommend to the other members of the Cabinet, these also being appointed by the Emperor, are imperial Princesses shall be ineligible as Premier, Cabinet Ministers, or advisors.
9. If the Premier on being impeached by Parliament does not dissolve Parliament he must resign, but one Cabinet shall not be allowed to dissolve Parliament more than once.
10. The Emperor shall assume direct control of the Army and Navy, but when that power is used with regard to internal affairs he must observe special conditions to be decided by Parliament, otherwise he is prohibited from exercising such power.
11. Imperial decrees cannot be made to replace the law, except in the event of immediate necessity, in which case decrees in the nature of a law may be issued in accordance with special conditions, but only when they are in connection with the execution of a law or what has by law been delegated.
12. International treaties shall not be concluded without the consent of Parliament, but the conclusion of peace or a declaration of war may be made by the Emperor, if Parliament is not sitting, the approval of Parliament to be obtained afterwards.
13. Ordinances in connection with the administration shall be settled by Acts of Parliament.
