## CHARLOTTETOWN AND QUEEN'S COUNTY

The closing of the Saturday evening dance class will take place tomorrow evening in Smallwood's Hall.

The poor skate at the Arena tonight will be the best of the season and a large crowd is expected.

The services of the Mt. Stewart circuit next Sunday, the 18th, will be—Marie at 11 a. m., Mt. Stewart at 3.15 p. m. and Fanning Brook at 7 p. m.

It is understood that the Uniform Rank, Knights of Pythias, of the Maritime Provinces, of which there are members in this city, are contemplating holding a camp at Moncton this year during the meeting of the Grand Lodge of the Maritime Provinces there. There are eight companies of the Uniform Rank in the Maritime Provinces and it is believed that a camp along the lines of those conducted in connection with the meeting of the Supreme Lodge at the various cities in the United States would prove a success.

The Christian Guardian, in its Conference Notes, says of Grace Church, Charlottetown, Rev. Wm. Harrison, pastor:—This is one of the heaviest charges in the conference. Yet the minister reports that in the three and a half years he has been there, he has been called to the cemetery 100 times. He has had 93 baptisms and 51 marriages. Recently he gave a certificate of membership to a person 93 years of age. Besides all his pastoral work, he has written a large number of articles for magazines and papers.

Rev. R. H. Stavert, a native of this province, now located in Harcourt, N. B., is on a trip to Dooktown, N. B., Fredericton and other places in the north of the province in the interests of the temperance cause. An exchange referring to the meeting at the first named place, says:—The meeting was addressed by Rev. R. H. Stavert, of Harcourt, Grand Worthy Patriarch of the Sons of Temperance. During the early part of the meeting Mr. Stavert used a stereopticon and showed quite a number of slides illustrative of different phases of the temperance question.

Special meetings will be held every evening next week in Bradalban Christian Church. Monday evening service will be conducted by Rev. H. R. Bell. On Tuesday evening the great evangelist W. H. Harding will conduct the service and will remain during the week. Mr. Harding has an international reputation as a preacher and lecturer having lectured in 29 different states, leading thousands to a higher life. He affords the people of the surrounding country a grand opportunity of hearing the Rev. Gentleman. Each one bring one? Strangers always welcome. Meetings will begin each evening at 7.30 p. m.

In a letter from Hon. Mr. McKinnon, Commissioner of Agriculture, to the Presidents and Secretaries of Farmers' Institutes that gentleman says: I would like to call your attention to the Report of the Commissioner appointed to inquire into the sheep industry in Canada, Great Britain and other countries, which is now being distributed by the Live Stock Branch, Ottawa. Those who were privileged to hear Mr. Ritch speak while in the Province must have felt that our knowledge of Sheep Husbandry is very inadequate and though our natural advantages are great they are more than offset by unskilled practice. The Report points out the best methods of the best shepherds, and sheep owners the world over, and to one listening to Mr. Ritch, it seemed that with little difficulty we could adjust ourselves to modern methods and that sheep raising in Prince Edward Island can be made most profitable. As the Report is full of information I would suggest that it be made a subject of discussion at one of your meetings, and as it is probable that arrangements could be made for lectures on this subject by an experienced man, within the next few months, any Institute desiring the services of such a man should write this department. I would also like to have a brief summary of your discussion of this subject and any conclusions at which you may arrive, or any suggestions you may have to make. Trusting to have your co-operation in this attempt to bring more information within easy reach of sheep owners, I remain, Yours Truly, Mundeck McKinnon, Commissioner of Agriculture.
