Referring to the pork market, the Canadian Grocer has the following to say: The past two weeks have been rather bewildering ones for Canadian packers. With the disastrous and continued slump of the American markets, the local situation has been exceedingly precarious and although the conditions here have not been so serious as across the line, the market has been away off, and there has been doubt as to what would happen next. The English market still held, was mainly at the stage reached in the recent drop. Pans "Killings" were no more than moderate last week, as, aggregating \$6,000, but a serious drop in American markets has been reflected pretty directly in Great Britain, something rather unusual. The Canadian market, while still considerably off, is much better than at last week's report. Prices are slightly firmer at the lower level, and there seems to be some feeling of confidence present. Packers are saying nothing, but are making the best of a troublesome situation. Prices quoted are: P. o. b at factory, \$1.75; fed and watered, 30c higher, and on hogs off cars at factory, \$5.25.
