FRICITION OVER BISLEY IS ENDED

LONDON, Nov. 11. (Special)—Colonel Crosse, of the National Rifle Association, states that Colonel Ward, of the War Office, has accepted membership on the council of the N. R. A. In view of the persistent rumors of friction existing between the War Office and the N. R. A., which was likely to affect the future of the Bisley meets, the announcement will be particularly pleasing to Bisley votaries in Canada.

Colonel Crosse also announces that the next Bisley meeting has been fixed to open on July 13, 1914, and that the following new regulations as to sighting have been made.

(1) That before individual competitions in which each shot is separately signalled, and which is not shot for shoulder to shoulder, one compulsory non-convertible sighting shot will be taken.

(2) There is to be no sighting shot before "A" competitions in which each shot is not separately signalled, in "B" team competitions in "C" before tie shooting, and in "D" before shoulder to shoulder shooting.

(3) In match rifle competitions there will have a central of 24 inches in diameter, to be marked with a V, which will count 6.

(4) In service rifle competitions the bullseye at 500 yards will be reduced from 18 inches to 16 inches in diameter.

CASE AGAINST ELLIS NOT OF PERJURY

TOKIO, Nov. 11.—The Japanese government holds that the case against John Ellis, business manager of the Japan Advertiser, whose extradition to the United States has been refused, was not one of perjury, according to the Japanese law, which requires false testimony during an examination in judicial procedure to be proved, Ellis, it is said, made an alleged perjurious affidavit in regard to his wife's insanity before an extrajudicial attorney.

The demand for the extradition of Ellis was made by the American Ambassador, the charge being perjury, as abduction, for which Ellis is said to be wanted in Boston, is not an extraditable offence.

A detective from the State of Massachusetts arrived here today in connection with the case.

OFF FOR COFFEE ROASTERS' CONVENTION

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—Two Pullman cars, bearing members of the local branch of the National Coffee Roasters' Association, left here today for Cincinnati, O., where the annual convention of that organization will be held this week. According to Ross W. Weir, president of the local association, a resolution was passed by that body at a recent informal dinner, praising the work of President Ach of the National Association, and recommending his re-election. One of the leading subjects to be discussed at the coming convention will be the proposed establishment of a bureau of coffee research, at some university of recognized standing.

The question of Brazilian coffee propaganda, including the proposal that the State of Sao Paulo shall make an appropriation for advertising coffee in this country, in a fight against substitutes, also will be discussed. A proposal to revise the constitution so as to admit jobbers of green coffee, will come up for consideration.

EGYPTIAN COTTON CROP REPORT

CAIRO, Nov. 11. (Special)—From official information it is now possible to form a fairly accurate estimate of the cotton crop.

In Lower Egypt the first and second pickings are completed except in the outlying northern districts. They are satisfactory and are about three per cent. above the average. The third picking is expected to be very bad.

In Upper Egypt the cotton is all picked and the sticks are being removed. The yield is unsatisfactory, being six per cent. below the average.

The Minia crop is of poor quality and the yield late. The bolls were attacked severely by the common boll worm and pink boll worms. As a result there was no third picking of the very inferior cotton.

LONDON INSTALLS NEW LORD MAYOR

LONDON, Nov. 10.—The time-honored Lord Mayor's show took place today, and the new Lord Mayor of London, Sir Thomas Van Sittart Bowater, was formally installed in office, succeeding Sir David Burnett. The route of the procession from the Guildhall to the Law Courts and return, was elaborately decorated with flags and hunting. The procession was exceedingly spectacular. Crowds of employed workmen and women were massed along the Victoria Embankment and at other points on the route, but their demonstrations were entirely orderly, and outside of "keeping the throng from breaking over the sidewalks into the roadway the forces of metropolitan police, that were massed along the line had little or nothing to do.

Sir Thomas Bowater, the new Lord Mayor, is fifty one years old and a native of Manchester. As a young man he came to London and engaged in business. He is now at the head of a large firm of paper makers. His rise to the office of chief magistrate of the City has been rapid. In 1889 he became a representative on the Court of Common Council, and in 1885-1896 was elected sheriff and later alderman. He is a great lover of outdoor sports and expects to do a great deal while in office for the Olympic Games.

WANDERERS HAVE LOCAL CHAMP- SHIP IN HALIFAX.

HALIFAX, N. S., Nov. 10.—In one of the hardest fought Rugby football games played here in years, the Wanderers on Saturday defeated Dalhousie University by a score of six to five, and won the local championship. Up to within five minutes of the close of the game the score stood five to three in Dalhousie's favor, but the Wanderers were awarded a free kick and from the 45 yards line Phillips sent the ball between the posts, which gave them three points and the game. Three thousand people saw the contest.

WOMEN JURORS TO HEAR TROUBLE

SANTA MONICA, CAL., Nov. 11.—A jury of women will be summoned to try Frank Seeley, a plumber, arrested twice during the last week on charges of disturbances growing out of troubles in his home.

A jury of men acquitted him last Monday. He pleaded not guilty to the second degree charge today and again demanded a jury trial.

The second trial was set for next Monday. As there are many women on the assessment roll of Santa Monica, no difficulty will be experienced in finding enough of that sex qualified to serve as jurors.

TEXAS CLUB WOMEN OPEN SESSION

CORPUS CHRISTI, TEX., Nov. 11.—The First Methodist Church was crowded this morning, when the sixteenth annual convention of the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs was called to order for its opening session by the federation president, Mrs. Eli Hertzberg. Women's clubs throughout the State are represented by delegates at this gathering which is better attended and more enthusiastic than any of the previous conventions of the organization.

Among the notable visitors attending the convention are Mrs. Philip N. Moore, past president of the General Federation and Miss Mary E. Goaring, associate professor of home economics at the University of Texas, who will confer with the members of the Federation and the various committees on the various phases of home economics and advise them of special lines of work the University is doing and in which the club women of the State are especially interested. The convention will remain in session until Friday and in addition to the general sessions there will be special sessions of the various departments.
