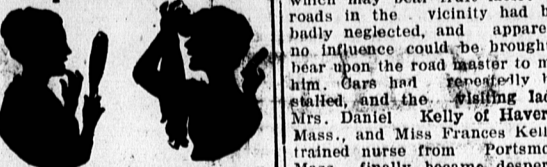
France will welcome the surplus men of Canada, United States, Australian and South America. The new association is working out a plan to finance the importation of husbands on a large scale.
