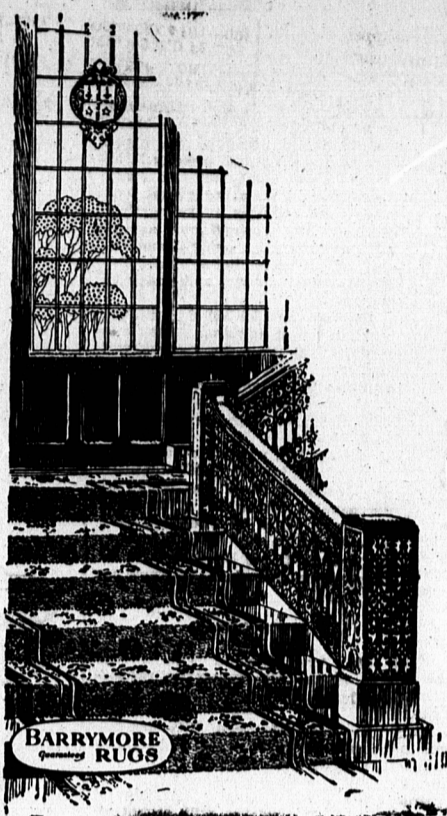

Livestock Market

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, April 19.—Dominion livestock report. Cattle receipts 839. There were a few lots of good steers on sale and the majority of these were sold for \$7.75. Two or three lots being held for higher price. Common and medium steers were about even with last weeks quotations. There were no real good cows offered. The best of the medium kinds were sold up to \$5.50 and common to medium cows mostly from \$4.25 to \$5.00. A few good bulls brought \$5.50. Quotations butcher steers, good \$7.25 to \$7.75, medium \$6.75 to \$7.25, common \$6.00 to \$6.50. Butcher heifers good \$6.75 to \$7.50, medium \$6.00 to \$6.50, common \$4.50 to \$5.75. Butcher cows medium \$3.75 to \$5.00, canners \$2.50, cullers \$2.75 to \$3.25. Butcher bulls good \$5.50 common \$4.00 to \$5.00. Calf receipts 562. Calves were about fifty cents higher than last week. Receipts were light and straight lots of common to medium quality sold from six fifty to seven dollars with a couple of small lots of better calves at \$8.00 and one or two choice veals at ten dollars. There were a number of very common calves included in the offering and these sold from \$6.00 to \$6.25 five. Quotations—Good veal \$8.00 to \$10.00, medium \$6.50 to \$7.00, common \$6.00 to \$6.25. Sheep receipts 29. Spring lambs sold from \$9.00 to \$12.00 each with the bulk at \$11.00. Good sheep generally eight dollars. Quotations Ewes \$5.00 to \$8.00. Hog receipts 957. The offering of hogs was light and practically all sales were made to local butchers. Trading was active and the ruling price was \$14.00 to \$14.50. A few heavy and poor hogs brought \$14.00 and sows \$12.00 with an odd trim young sow \$2.00.
