German Rush Reinforcements To Russian Front

Seek To Prevent Major Debacle At Orel Sector

LONDON, July 29 — German units from as far as France and Germany rushed into the threatened Orel sector of the Russian front tonight as the formidable Red artillery pounded the drenched countryside and the Russian cavalry charged through the mud to batter the weary German defenders, who were pushed back six miles and killed 40,000.

The Soviet Thursday midnight offensive driving troops hurriedly to the front, the Germans were snatching reinforcements from every available front in their determination to prevent a major debacle at Orel, a key town in the entire German defence.

The communiqué described them as "march battalions," a German expression meaning troops hurriedly organized and sent to the front before completing their full training.

More than 3,000 Germans were killed in the Orel fighting today as the battle raged fiercely despite the rain and mud that sent troops floundering and splashing in attack and counter-attack.

One Red army cavalry unit smashed through weary German defenders at three strongly fortified places north of Orel. The Germans ran, leaving behind them 600 of their dead comrades and large quantities of arms, said the communiqué recorded by the Soviet Monitor.

Increase Shown In Island Fishery Returns For June

HALIFAX, July 29 — (CP) — Total fish landings in the Maritime Provinces last month showed increases of 5,910,200 pounds and \$1,019,512, as compared with June of last year, the eastern fisheries division reported today.

The total quantity of all fish landed was 74,646,700 pounds, with a landed value of \$3,094,952. Increases occurred in the catches and value of lobsters, mackerel, haddock, salmon, herring and pollock. Catches of sardines, hake and cod decreased but the value of cod was higher.

Nova Scotia had increases of 6,095,300 pounds and \$569,264. In New Brunswick the total catch decreased by 186,900 pounds but the landed value increased by \$264,810. Decreases of more than 1,000,000 pounds occurred in the catches of sardines and herring, although the landed value of sardines decreased by only \$1,673.

Nova Scotia's total volume was 30,755,100 pounds, and New Brunswick's 18,322,200.

Total figures for Prince Edward Island were 5,059,400 pounds and \$438,606 — increases of 116,800 pounds and \$185,438.

War Situation Last Night

Foundering, floundering Italy is on notice from Gen. Eisenhower, Allied commander in the western and central Mediterranean war theatre, to jettison the Nazis along with Fascism — or go down in utter ruin.

There is no middle course. Rome now has heard the capitulation terms from the three men who hold Italy's fate in their hands, Prime Minister Churchill, President Roosevelt and Gen. Eisenhower. It has heard also from Eisenhower that once the German army in Italy is driven out with at least passive Italian help, an honorable and "beneficial" peace will come to the hapless nation wrecked by the mad ambitions of Mussolini.

"You can have peace," said the Eisenhower surrender summons dinned endlessly into Italian ears from African and other broadcasting stations. "You can have peace, immediately, and peace under honorable conditions which our governments have already offered you. It was by acts more than words, however, that Gen. Eisenhower drove home his ultimatum. Under intensifying pressure of his mighty army in Sicily, the whole right wing of Nazi-Fascist resistance from the northern sea coast to the central pivot west of the Mount Etna bastion was crumbling.

Eisenhower developed his forces to hit his hardest blow in the centre while his brother right flank tied down major enemy armour and mobile forces on the Catania front and his left put pressure relentlessly on the weaker north coast positions.

The pattern followed avoided a costly British frontal assault on the terribly formidable east coast Etna shelf. The whole Etna position is a classic example of modern military tactics. It bids fair to leave what is left of the Axis garrison in Sicily penned up on the narrow, mountainous tip of the Messina Peninsula just as Axis forces in Tunisia were trapped in their escape under the avalanche of bombs awaiting an effort to cross the narrow Messina Strait to the mainland suggests their mass surrender is only a matter of time.

The Etna barrier finally gives way to permit a converging American-Canadian-British pursuit from three sides simultaneously.

Rome must reckon with those stark military facts in making its decision. It would take a bold man to say now that tomorrow or next day might not see the final Italian collapse, and unquestioning acceptance of the Churchill-Roosevelt-Eisenhower surrender terms.

No Additional Coffee In Canada

OTTAWA, July 29 — (CP) — R. T. Mohan, Prices Board Administrator of tea, coffee and spices, issued tonight a statement replying to inquiries from across Canada as to whether the Canadian coffee ration could be lifted or increased in view of President Roosevelt's announcement last night of the end of coffee rationing in the United States.

Mr. Mohan explained that in the first place shipments of coffee into Canada are on a definite shipping-space allotment and while they arrive mostly at United States ports and come overland, these allotments have not been increased and the entry of Canada's supply has not been hastened. At present, Canada has about a four-month supply of coffee, an insufficient stockpile on which to base an increased ration.

Secondly, tea and coffee are rationed in Canada on the same basis as other commodities. Because of the low ration and the relatively high coffee ration allowed on the basis of consumption value, coffee consumption has risen more than 15 per cent over the pre-war normal, while tea consumption has declined almost 50 per cent.

Hopes Raised For Quick End To Campaign

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN NORTH AFRICA, July 29 — (AP) — American and Canadian troops have cracked the mountainous core of the Messina bridgehead to raise hopes tonight of a quick conquest of northeastern Sicily.

In a swift 12-mile overnight advance the Americans captured the inland road junction of Nicotia at the base of the Axis triangle and the Canadians overran the Village of Agira, seven miles to the southeast in a race for the western site of Mount Etna.

The seizure of the two towns threatened to collapse both Axis flanks, the northern one based at Stefano Di Camastaro on the Tyrrhenian sea, and the eastern anchor at Catania on the Ionian sea.

In Washington the United States undersecretary of war, Robert Patterson, said the final conquest of Sicily was a matter of days.

The two seizures were described as the most important strategic developments of the last week for they cut direct communications between the two Axis flanks, and threatened to cause a general German withdrawal from the Catania area where the British 8th army has been tied down in trench warfare.

It is estimated 40,000 Germans are spread between Catania and the northern coast along the Mount Etna foothills. The capture of Nicotia and Agira, however, deprived them of means to rush reinforcements into the central area except for circuitous coastal roads running through Messina at the northeastern tip of their bridgehead.

The break-through came just when reinforced German divisions had been digging in for a siege, utilizing the natural mountainous defences.

Axis positions along the northern and eastern coasts may roll back almost automatically if the Canadian American drive reaches the road

Allies Throw Out Choice Bait To Italy

LONDON, July 29 — (CP) — Premier Winston Churchill tonight dismissed the Fascist packed Italian legislature today and sought by force of arms to still the clamorous clamor for climatic battles or a suit for peace.

Both German and Italian troops were dispatched to Fiume and Trieste to combat separatist demonstrations among the 600,000 Croats and Slovenes of Istria, Swiss dispatches said.

The Allies threw out what was presumably their choicest bait to entice Italy out of the war—a pledge by Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, commander of the Allied forces in Italy, to grant Italy's unconditional surrender.

Asked at his press conference if the Italians had made any progress in their efforts to obtain a separate peace, he said there was none to his knowledge.

He tacitly endorsed Eisenhower's declaration to the Italians today, with an assertion of his confidence in the Allied commander's sound judgment in dealing with military affairs at the front. Eisenhower told the Italian people in a broadcast today that the presence of German troops in Italy is the only obstacle to an honorable peace.

Canadian Troops Are Within Sight Of Mt. Etna

WITH THE CANADIANS IN CENTRAL SICILY, July 29 (CP) — The Canadian Light Infantry are within sight of towering Mount Etna, around which are strung the last strong defensive positions of the enemy on Sicily.

The mountain strongholds of Leonforte and Assoro, neighboring towns 15 miles northeast of Catania, were captured by the Canadian Division Thursday (July 22).

(This dispatch was apparently held up by the military censorship until yesterday (Thursday) when the announcement by Allied headquarters in North Africa of the capture of Leonforte.)

For the last four days heavy fighting has raged around these towns.

The Canadians finally stormed into Leonforte and captured the Canadian Light Infantry ousted the last Germans from the town after a battle that was in the balance of Leonforte consolidated our positions and gave the Canadians great advantages for further operations. This new position dominates the roads leading to the east towards Mount Etna and Catania.

"This victory at Leonforte was one of the most important achieved so far by the forces of Maj.-Gen. Guy Simonds.

The Germans are being cooped up in the Mount Etna area slowly but determinedly by the American and Canadian advances in Central Sicily and by the pressure of British Army forces to the south-east.

Price Of Fruits, Vegetables Proving Tough Problem

OTTAWA, July 29 — (CP) — Controlling the prices of fresh fruits and vegetables is proving one of the toughest problems the Prices Board has faced.

While no method of applying a ceiling has yet been devised, officials of the Board and authorities on agricultural produce have not hesitated to set up a study today and are continuing a study that has been going on for some time in an effort to bring relief to housewives who have been complaining of unprecedented prices, both in stores and on their local markets.

Kenneth W. Taylor, Foods Control Ordinator for the Board, gave public recognition to the problem earlier this week when in announcing the freezing of wholesale prices of canned goods, he said the Board was "well aware of and seriously concerned with the abnormally high prices on fresh fruits and vegetables this spring."

Speaking of the Board's efforts to apply some control he added: "The freezing of wholesale prices of these fresh products, but with the best possible advice available to the consumer, is the most practical plan toward this end."

It was said today however that the Board has not abandoned its efforts to control the price of bringing these prices under control. Both the method of marketing fresh fruits and vegetables and the variations in size and quality make the problem extremely complicated.

Henry Ford 80 Today

DETROIT, July 29 — (AP) — Henry Ford, who will observe his 80th birthday anniversary tomorrow, has had in nearly 26 years. He has taken over again the presidency and general management of the Ford Company following the death of his son, Edsel Ford, in 1943.

Ford, who developed an initial investment of \$28,000 four decades ago into an industry which today has assets worth more than \$800,000,000 stressed that his company has been able to do "many things that need to be done" because it has been "free from all stockholders and financial control."

"We never made money our main object," he said. "We regarded it as one of the tools, one of the by-products of business, and as a result we always found that we had enough."

"Money is just a part of a practical life—saves time in exchanging goods—and is no good for anything else. People who desire to live off money, thinking that money is wealth, easily become parasites. We never believed that we could be prosperous alone. Real prosperity is prosperity for all."

16 U. S. Planes Raid Hong Kong

NEW YORK, July 29 — (AP) — The Tokyo Radio reported in a broadcast that 16 U. S. planes raided Hong Kong today, dropping 10 bombs which caused "slight damage."

The report was recorded by the U.S. foreign broadcast intelligence service.

There was no allied confirmation of the raid. U.S. planes also raided Hong Kong two days ago, a raid first reported by the Japanese.

Badoglio Convinced That Game Is Up?

MADRID, July 29 — (AP) — Accounts of developments in Italy made available today by Italian sources in Madrid gave a picture of distrust between the Germans and Italians which has halted, at least temporarily, plans for the German reinforcement of Italy.

One version even described the new Italian Premier, Benito Mussolini, as convinced that his government could not continue the war and as having told the German ambassador that the game was up.

Canada To Have Sufficient Tobacco

OTTAWA, July 29 — (CP) — The total of 340,000 pounds of flue-cured American tobacco allocated to Canada for the year ending next June 30 under a new United States-Canada-United Kingdom agreement, announced today in Washington, "is sufficient" for Canadian needs, an official of the Prices Board tobacco administration said tonight.

"Canada is quite self-sufficient in the matter of flue-cured tobacco," he said, adding that the relative small quantity allocated to the Dominion was an indication of the "great stride" Canada has been making in that field in recent years.

Fire Destroys Mill

CANTERBURY, N.B., July 29 — (CP) — Fire of an unknown origin which broke out shortly after three o'clock this morning completely razed the mill of the Dominion Paper Co. for a time threatened the entire village.

Damage was estimated at approximately \$10,000 with no insurance.

Japs Told More Ships Are Essential

NEW YORK, July 29 — (AP) — The Tokyo radio told the Japanese people today that it was "absolutely essential" that Japan concentrate on shipbuilding if she hoped to capitalize on the rich resources of conquered areas, the United States office of war information reported.

Lack of shipping "determined the fate of Germany in the first world war," the broadcast warned, pointing out that lack of transport facilities prevents the shipping of products from Java, Borneo, Burma and other occupied areas to Japan.

10 Jap Ships Sunk

WASHINGTON, July 29 — (AP) — The United States navy announced today that American submarines have sunk 10 Japanese merchant vessels and damaged four in recent operations in the Pacific.

Tough Fighting For Jap Base At Munda

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN THE SOUTHWEST PACIFIC, July 30 — (Friday) — (AP) — Precise low-level bombing that crashed just 50 yards from allied troops is speeding the American offensive against the important Munda air base on New Georgia island in the central Solomons.

A week ago more than 200 planes dropped 186 tons of explosives in the heaviest raid ever made in the south Pacific.
