EASTERN CHRISTENDOM TO ADOPT GREGORIAN CALENDAR SHORTLY

CONSTANTINOPLE, May 31—On October 1, the ecclesiastical calendar of Eastern Christendom will be brought into harmony with the Gregorian calendar. Instead of sticking to the Julian, the Congress of all Orthodox Churches, now in session under the presidency of Patriarch Meletios, has decided.

On October 1 thirteen days will be added to the calendar, making it October 14, the same as most of the rest of the world. The change is due to the fact that most of the Oriental countries have adopted the Gregorian calendar the latest country to do so being Greece.

The decision unifies celebration of all fixed Christian feast days in both east and west. As for Easter the congress decided the Gregorian method of reckoning it is erroneous. Delegates look forward to adoption of a scientific calendar everywhere that will make Easter a fixed feast.

Meanwhile the congress charged the observatories at Athens, Belgrade, Bucharest and Petrograd to draw up a table fixing Easter scientifically until the year 2,000.

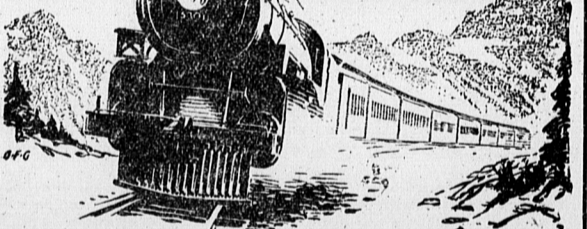

FUEL OIL SUBSTITUTES PLENTIFUL IN SWEDEN

STOCKHOLM, May 31.—Sweden can face the menace of world shortage of petroleum with relative calm, in spite of having no domestic supply of that fuel, according to Axel F. Enstrom, a leading Swedish industrial and financial expert, in recent address before the Association of Swedish Industries.

One of the most important sources of fuel oil which has recently been experimented with her is bituminous shale. It was estimated by the speaker, that the Swedish shale deposits could yield about 500,000,000 tons of shale oil. Production on a small scale is at present being carried on.

A still more practical substitute for petroleum is wood alcohol, said Mr. Enstrom. And Sweden could within a short time produce wood alcohol in quantities corresponding to the present consumption of gasoline. Its manufacture as a by-product of chemical wood pulp is particularly economical. The existing factories have a capacity of about 5,000,000 gallons of wood alcohol a year, and with new building and still more highly developed methods of conservation, he declared, this capacity could be increased to about 17,000,000 gallons a year.

Finally, Sweden, because of her great hydro-electric resources, will in the future permit a very much greater use of electricity stored in batris. Almost every section of the country is now served by the net of power lines, and electricity could be drawn from them for the use of passenger cars, trucks and tractors.
