Man Survives Frozen Sleep

Lieut.-Colonel Sir Reginald Rankin, who for 29 years survived his frozen sleep, has died at Bryngwyn, England, at the age of 60. He is the only man known to science who awoke after being frozen to sleep. In 1902 he climbed Mount Aconcagua (23,080 feet), on the border of Argentina and Chile, and on his descent was overtaken by a blizzard at an altitude of 20,000 feet, where he was frozen to sleep. Later, after terrible experiences, he got to safety and his toes were subsequently amputated. Sir Reginald began traveling at an early age, and while in India shot the biggest snow leopard on record.

Cupid's Smithy May Move

Gretna Green, Scotland, scene of

many marriages of elopers, may lose its famous smithy, where the ceremonies are performed over the anvil. The crued building may be demolished or moved to the United States unless the decision of the local court to increase the tax assessment is overruled by a higher court. The Dumfries Valuation Court has decided that the owners of the smithy shall pay taxes on an assessment of \$2,500, instead of \$190, and the owners will have to find \$1,625 a year instead of \$125. George Mackie, one of the owners, said that if the as-

essment is not reduced they may accept the offer from the United States.
