Decline Continues In Stock Market Prices

NEW YORK, Feb. 13 (AP)—Last week was one of declining prices on the stock exchange.

Average prices at the end of the week were the lowest since last March.

At that time the market for stocks had been badly upset by the break in commodity prices. And this week another bad spill in the Chicago grain pits and in other commodities was a factor in the decline in stocks.

The market got off to a bad start Monday and never was able to change its direction for long at a time except for a modest comeback Tuesday when the averages scored the only gain of the week—a plus mark of 2 of a point.

Selling was never urgent last week as attested by the relatively light weekly turnover of 5,033,330 shares for the five full days the market was open. (It was closed Saturday for the Lincoln birthday).

There was a little better than 4,685,740 in the previous week, but still small as volume goes.

Several good stocks inched ahead, one or two on considerable volume.

Interest in gold generally, and in particular a return to a free gold market, has steadily widened since the end of the war.

At Toronto (CP)—Prices wandered in quiet trading in Saturday's short session on the Toronto Stock Exchange. Stocks drifted irregularly on a slightly easier level.

Gold managed to gain some ground on advance by a handful of junior producers. Base metals were down. Western oils weakened.

Hollinger, Teck-Hughes and Wright-Hargreaves slipped lower in senior golds while added 1-4. East Malartic, Kirkland Lake, Pickle Crow, Macassa and Sylvanite showed penny advances in the juniors.

Consolidated Smelters continued downwards in a weaker base metals list, losing \$1 at \$105. Noranda, selling ex-dividend, \$1, slipped 3-4 and Waste Amulet attracted some attention towards the close. The stock, ex-dividend 40 cents, added

MONTREAL, Feb. 13 (CP)—Selected issues continued to edge into lower ground during slow dealing on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market Saturday.

Papers, metals, oils and steels posted further declines. Utilities and mines were slightly improved. Price adjustments, however, were confined to minor fractions. Zeller's Common was an exception, off three points at a new low of 39.

Industrial trading was at a new standstill during the two-hour session. Turnover was set at approximately 10,700 shares, compared with 20,800 the previous Saturday.

Mining sales were slightly higher totalling 80,100 shares against the previous Saturday's total of 54,600.

Of 120 issues traded on the two markets, 25 were higher, 40 were lower and 55 remained unchanged. Four new 1949 highs and 18 new lows were established.

Closing averages showed utilities had gained 2 and golds 34 while banks slipped .03 and 6 Industrials were off .1 at a new low of 122.6.

The New Royalite issue closed at a new high of \$6.60.

Empire Life Sets New Sales Record

KINGSTON, February 12: "Company progress in 1948 was noteworthy in several important respects" stated C. P. Fell, President, at the Annual Meeting of The Empire Life Insurance Company here.

"Realized surplus on insurance account was the largest in the company's history, permitting more liberal provision to be made for participating policyholders. The favorable mortality experience of the past year contributed substantially to this result and reflects the sound and progressive nature of the Company's growth."

"Sales of new insurance likewise, in Canada and the British West Indies, established a new high record of business in force—\$83,143,267 at December 31, 1948 owned by 48,000 policyholders. Insurance in force on more than doubled in the past ten years."

"Results arising from the investment of the company's assets were most satisfactory. After a period of 15 years of declining rates of interest—an experience common throughout the industry—the average rate in 1948 increased from 3.85% to 4%. This new trend, welcome as it is, will not of course, result in any immediate material increase in total earnings. Its effect, if continued, will be one of very gradual improvement."

"It will be noted," Mr. Fell continued "that the distribution of securities by types has undergone a significant shift during the past year. The change is not unexpected. During war years investment opportunities were limited principally to government bonds at low interest rates. Life insurance companies subscribed generously to this type of investment to the exclusion of most others. The result in most cases was a portfolio too heavy with low interest bearing government bonds. This situation necessitated the company taking advantage of the broader investment opportunities in more recent years which included municipal and corporate securities at higher yield rates. In all investment transactions safety of principle was the predominant consideration."

"First mortgages increased \$350,000. The percentage of assets invested in Preferred and Common Stocks is lower than for several past years and real estate owned, other than the United Office premises, was reduced to negligible proportions. None of the company's mortgages or bonds is in default."

A dividend of 4% was declared on the capital stock payable 1st March to shareholders of record 1st February, 1949.

Mr. H. H. Blackman, F.A.S., F.A.I.A., General Manager, announced the appointment of Mr. W. J. Logie, B.A. (Oxon.), F.F.A., as Actuary of the Company.
