MALCOLM A. McLEOD

The death of Malcolm A. McLeod occurred this morning at his home, 131 Erin Street, at the age of seventy-two years. Capt. William McDonald, for many years a well known master mariner and vessel owner, died on Saturday morning at the Providence St. Joseph's Home, Shediac. Capt. McDonald, the well known attorney of Shediac, and Mrs. Eliza Clune of Shediac, N. Y.

MR. JOHN A. MCKINNON

The following clipping taken from a Salt Lake (Utah) newspaper, announcing the sad accident which befell the late John A. McKinnon, a former resident of St. Peter's Bay, was received by Mrs. Daniel McInnis a sister of the unfortunate man from relatives in the U. S. A.

"John McKinnon, 65 years of age lies at the point of death at Holy Cross Hospital as a result of burns which he suffered shortly after 4 o'clock yesterday morning in the pit being excavated for the new Continental National Bank building at Second South and Main Streets. The burns were caused by the explosion of a gas-line stove, one of several kept burning to prevent cement from freezing. The left side of his body is a mass of burns. It was McKinnon's duty to inspect the stoves, several were inspected and found to be in a satisfactory condition, and as he bent to examine another, a mass of liquid flame that almost completely covered the left side of his body. His clothing was ablaze in a moment. Dragging the stove with him to prevent it setting fire to other combustible material near by, McKinnon climbed from the excavation and reached the side walk. His cries attracted the attention of a nearby hotel clerk who summoned the fire department. As help arrived McKinnon dropped to the side walk. Guests in hotels near the scene heard the cries and hurried to the street to learn the cause. With the arrival of the police and fire departments the flames were extinguished and McKinnon was taken to the Emergency hospital and later to the Holy Cross hospital."

The John McKinnon referred to above left St. Peter's about 42 years ago. He was 25 years in the State of Michigan and the remainder of his time he lived in Salt Lake City, Utah. He was married and leaves a widow and ten of a family. Four brothers, Frank, Donald, Ronald, and Lauchlin and two sisters Mrs. Daniel McInnis and Nancy still reside at St. Peter's.

The accident occurred on March 1st and his funeral took place on March 5th. To all the sorrowing relatives of the unfortunate man their many friends extend their sincere sympathy.
