Scotland Yard Smashes Racket To "Rig" Hound Racing

LONDON, Jan. 8 (CP)—The rabbit was on its way, the greyhound traps were sprung, but one of the racers just walked from the cage and curled to only be ground. That was more than a year ago and combined with similar stories from throughout the 'country of dogs' made the 'racket' a hot topic of investigation by Scotland Yard which has since then been on charges of drugging the animals. Flying squad members continue searching, meanwhile for other members of the 'racket'. The three were convicted after a four-day trial at historic Old Bailey of 'conspiring with others to defraud people who might bet on greyhound racing results.' Experts were puzzled when from various tracks came reports of dogs, regarded as certain winners, being afflicted by a strange malady which made them indifferent to running. Then Alva Denise Ashley, the dancer, came on the scene. She had been asked to apply for a post as kennel-maid (girls have replaced called-up men as kennel hands at most tracks) at Wembley Stadium and was promised big money if she would administer a certain drug to certain dogs. The drug, she was told, would make the racers drowsy for a short time and would have no permanent effects. The druggist followed a few days later. Police believe the convictions broke the back of the gang attempting to 'rig' racing.
