Government snow ploughs would have the road cleared to Summerside by today, officials stated. During Thursday night's heavy gale, the fleet Rocky Point ferry landing, across the harbor from Charlottetown was submerged and ferry service across the harbor was consequently disrupted yesterday causing great inconvenience to farmers anxious to haul their potatoes and turnips to Charlottetown where a large freighter was loading the port's final cargo for the season. A tree was uprooted at the corner of Pownal and Water Streets and a heavy metal ventilator was blown from the roof of a livery stable. Summerside members of the Charlottetown Community Concert Association were unable to reach the city by motor to attend the recital here last night. Motorists arriving in the city late Thursday afternoon had unusual experiences. They were compelled to take down fences and proceed through fields in order to get around the drifts. Cars were stuck all along the route. Little snow fell in the city.
