CANADA'S LEAD

Economic activity in Canada at the end of the third quarter of this year, reports the Financial Post, reached a new high point in the climb from the depths of the depression.

Foremost among these changes is the drastic reduction in long-term interest rates. This decline, which has been going on steadily throughout the year, reached a point at the end of the quarter where the yield on government bonds was reduced below 3.5 per cent.

As Canada's prosperity is largely dependent on export markets, the outlook for the future is clouded somewhat by the failure of other world countries to keep pace with the Dominion during the third quarter of the year.
