

THE CANADA MEDICAL ACT BEING ACCEPTED.

It is now nearly ten years since Dr. Riddick of Montreal introduced what is now the Canada Medical Act in the Dominion Parliament. The bill, in brief, aimed at establishing one set of examinations and one standard of qualifications for the practice of medicine throughout the Dominion of Canada, in place of the different examinations and varying standard of qualifications of the individual Provinces. The bill was passed in 1902, but owing to objections raised to certain features by Provinces jealous as to their existing rights it was found impossible to give it effect.

About two years ago a meeting of the representatives of the Provincial Medical Councils was held in Montreal when Dr. Riddick succeeded in securing the consent of all to certain amendments which he proposed to the original act. These amendments, removing the earlier objections, were embodied in a bill which was passed last winter by the Parliament in Ottawa. It is part of the Act as it now stands that the Provinces give their consent to the principle of the Act through a bill passed by their own Legislatures, and this step has been taken in seven of the nine Provinces. The Quebec Legislature took the required action but a few days ago.

The two Provinces which have not yet formally accepted the principle of the Act by their own legislative action are Ontario and British Columbia.

SOUTH RENFREW.

Tomorrow will be election day in South Renfrew, Ontario, where Hon. George P. Graham carries the Liberal standard and Dr. Maloney is the Conservative candidate. The lull in politics throughout the Dominion turns the attention of all the politicians to the one spot where an active and bitter political campaign is going on. Moreover some parts of South Renfrew are barely fifty miles from Ottawa where the national leaders and lieutenants of both parties are, and whence the fight is being directed. For which, and for other reasons the battle is a hot one.

Among the other reasons referred to is the fact that the vacancy was created by the resignation of the Liberal member-elect, Mr. Low, on purpose to provide a seat for Mr. Graham, who was defeated in Brockville. The Liberals are especially desirous that Mr. Graham shall have a seat in the Commons, to lead the Opposition's Ontario wing, and by many he is looked upon as the coming

bla, but it confidently expected that favorable action will be taken in the British Columbia Legislature very shortly, and in Ontario the Medical Council of the Province favors like action, which will probably be brought about within the current session.

When the consent of all the Provinces has been secured it is intended that a meeting of representatives of all the Medical Councils shall be convened at Ottawa during the coming summer when the Dominion Medical Council, as authorized by the Canada Medical Act will be formed. Should either the Ontario or British Columbia Legislatures fail to sanction the Dominion Act, it will be proposed to amend the Act so that the seven or eight consenting Provinces may go forward with the organization.

The movement is an interesting and important one and when consummated will not only bring about uniform standards of qualification and uniform examinations but will enable any qualified medical practitioner, who may now be limited to a single Province, to practice his profession in any part of the Dominion. The Dominion Medical Council will have full authority over the purely professional subjects, while the universities will probably exercise the same authority as they now do over the non-professional subjects of the examinations.

leader of the Liberal party in Canada when Sir Wilfrid Laurier shall have grown too old to hold that position. Moreover, South Renfrew has the reputation of being a corrupt constituency, where \$30,000 to \$40,000 is spent in human devices on each side in a Dominion election.

South Renfrew has been mainly a Liberal riding for years past, and Mr. Low was elected in September last by over six hundred majority, notwithstanding the way the political tide was running at that time. But the Liberal party was then in power, and to a capricious and more or less corrupt constituency that makes a great difference. Power and patronage are now on the other side. This is somewhat balanced by the fact that months ago an agreement was made by leading Conservatives and Liberals in the riding that Mr. Graham should have the seat unopposed on condition that a Conservative should be returned unopposed to the Ontario Legislature. And the Conservative did get the seat in the Legislature without opposition.

The bargain was not a commendable one, and it could not bind all the electors, but viewed as a bargain between the two parties, carried out in good faith by the Liberals, and of which the Conservatives got the full benefit, it is believed by many Liberals and Conservatives alike to have become binding and that hence Mr. Graham ought to be elected, as we anticipate he will be. Furthermore, Mr. Graham is needed in Parliament to strengthen the fighting forces of the Opposition which were sadly depleted by the September election. The return of Mr. Graham will in no way endanger the position of the Government whose voting strength will remain precisely the same as it was before Mr. Low resigned.

VOTING ON UNION.

As was anticipated, but with perhaps a larger majority than was expected, Zion Presbyterian Church in Charlottetown has decided in favor of church union. Features to be noted were that the vote in favor of Union in the abstract was considerably larger than for the Basis of Union—203 for Union and 176 for the Basis. Of the nine elders, who by reason of their official position may be assumed to be wise in such matters, seven voted for Union and two against, while the vote of the elders on the basis was five for and four against.

Taking the entire votes of elders, communicants and adherents, the majority for Union was 147 and for the Basis 117, a difference of 30. This indicates perhaps more of doubt than of opposition, in regard to the soundness and sufficiency of the Basis. The majority for union in Zion Church, is large, but even there the number opposed is far too large to be ignored. The same may prove true of the vote on this great question throughout Canada in the religious bodies immediately concerned.

NOTES.

Nanking, the new capital and republican headquarters in China, is situated on the Yang Tse Kiang River, some two hundred miles inland from the mouth of the river where Shanghai is located.
