British Seek To Join The French Army On Somme

Morale Of Soldiers High Despite Grave Situation—Allies Show Ever Increasing Determination To Fight To Victory.

(By J. F. Sanderson, Canadian Press Staff Writer) LONDON, May 28—(CP Cable)—The British Expeditionary Force in Flanders tonight was engaged furiously with Germans in a drive aimed at penetrating southward to join the main French army which pressed a rescue drive from the Somme.

GERMANS ON THREE SIDES

surrounded on three sides by the German invaders, and their flank exposed by the surrender of Leopold, these men must fight their way through the German wall to join forces with the French on the Somme front—or perish in the attempt.
