Maritimes (Continued from page 1) 21-per-cent increase granted by the Board in March. Hearings into the railways' new application, involving some \$85,000,000 a year in freight tolls, had been expected to open this month before the Board.

Deny Railway Contention - They "deny" the railway contention that changed conditions since March make rate increases necessary.

Other general arguments of the Provinces against the proposed new tolls include: 1. That the railways miscalculated in estimating that the C.P.R., without a new increase, would have a "deficiency" of \$200,000,000 in railway operating revenues this year.

Special Arguments - Besides arguing generally with the other Provinces against an increase, the Maritimes also cited special arguments against boosts for that area.

The Maritime submission says a percentage increase in rates established under the Maritime Freight Rates Act of 1927 would violate the statute.

Under that Act a 20-per-cent reduction in tolls is provided for certain hauls in the Maritimes. The Dominion compensates the railways.

The Maritime brief declares percentage increases generally would be "unduly prejudicial" to persons and industries in that area dependent on long-distance hauls to the central part of the country.

It suggests any increases on certain long-haul commodities should be limited by ceiling.
