AN AGED LADY GONE TO REST

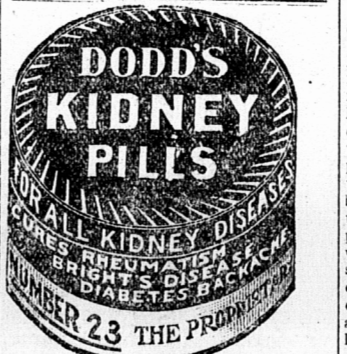
