Many people asked in what position is Summerside to take care of a case of smallpox should the disease strike this place? The building immediately west of the town which was some years ago fitted up for a hospital is not in fit condition for patients and would require considerable repairs before being made suitable for the reception of such and in fact it is said on good authority that the building could not readily be put in respectable condition without a great amount of expense. And moreover the location is bad. Situated in a swampy section exposed to dampness and cold it is a most undesirable place for smallpox patients. Some have suggested that the large residence known as the Pope House, near St. Eleanor's be fitted up as an hospital. Whatever building made ready a good deal of expense must be incurred and it is a question amongst ratepayers whether or not the town is in a position to bear the burden. Many are of the opinion that the Provincial Government should assist in the hospital matter. Smallpox in Summerside would endanger other parts of the Province and so should outlying districts come to the rescue in so serious a question. However some action along this line is necessary and there is no time like the present to begin. "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure and citizens should proceed at once to fight off the disease which so threatens our shores and prepare themselves for an attack.
