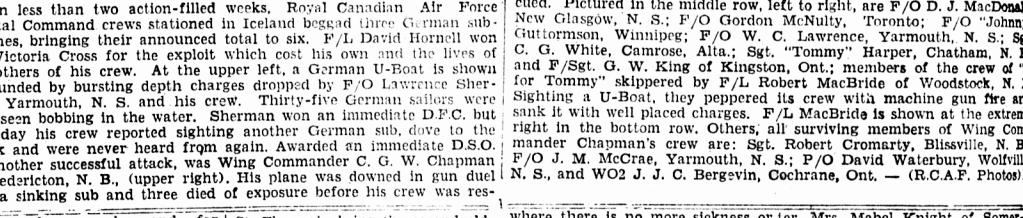

In Memoriam

MRS RICHARD MCINNIS

Death has claimed one of Waterford's most respected citizens in the person of Mrs. Richard McInnis, 84, who died on Sept. 19th at the home of her nephew Patrick Doucette.

Mrs. McInnis was born in Waterford on Sept. 9th, 1858, and remained a resident for 86 years until she was called to her heavenly home.

She was apparently in good health until a few months before her death, when she gradually became weaker and in spite of the best attention and care given to prolong her life was unable to do so.

There are left to mourn the loss of a kind mother, four daughters and four sons. Mrs. McInnis was the mother of Peter Aylward, Rufford, Maine; Thomas of Winnipeg; Manitoba Howard and George of Boston; Merle in the Canadian Army Service Corps and John of Halifax, N. S.

The funeral which was largely attended by the congregation of the Catholic Church at Palmer Road on Friday July 21st at 10 a.m. where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Father Patrick Walsh who also recited the prayers at the grave.

The pall bearers were: Messrs. Patrick and George Doucette, William Aylward, Edward Kenny, Albert MacDonald and Albert Kennedy.

MARY LLEWELLYN THOMAS The community of Covehead has been greatly shocked and saddened by the tragic death of Mary Llewellyn Thomas, aged 23 years, daughter of Mrs. Francis Thomas of West Covehead, P. E. I., by drowning in the Ottawa River at Britannia, Ottawa, Ont., at 2 p.m. on Monday, August 14, 1944.

Unable to swim, Miss Thomas stepped off into deep water while wading in the river with a friend, Mr. Gerald W. Campbell. Every effort possible to save her was in vain, and her body was not recovered until 7 a.m. next morning, though five rowboats and the R. C. M. P. crash launch helped in the search.

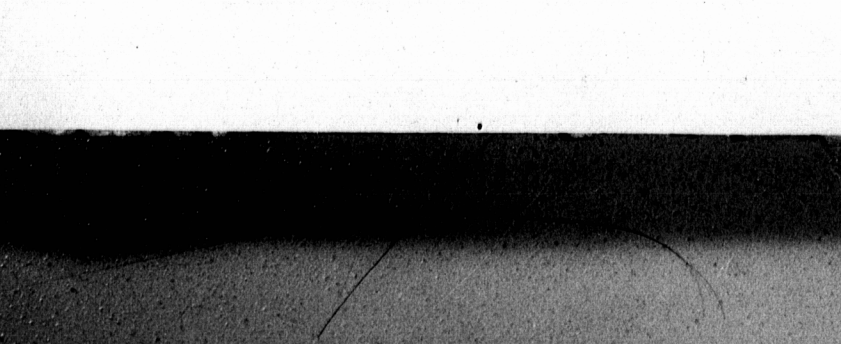
A touching funeral service was conducted by Rev. W. H. Cramm of Ottawa, in the Tubman Funeral Parlors, Westboro, where the remains had been taken, after which the body was forwarded to her late home in West Covehead, where funeral services were held on Friday, Aug. 18, in St. James United Church there, of which Miss Thomas was a communicant member.

The services were conducted by Rev. Thomas A. Wilson, her minister, assisted by Professor John Hughes of McGill University, President of the Welsh Society of Montreal, who gave a beautiful prayer in Welsh, the native tongue of Miss Thomas' mother. The large church was filled by friends and neighbors from nearby and far away.
