## N.H.L. Rosters Are Reduced To Fourteen Men

BOSTON, Nov. 23. (AP)—The National Hockey League board of governors today voted to reduce the number of players on each club from 17 to 14 men as a wartime measure.

The board also decided to suspend the existing rule requiring a minimum of 12 players on each club for the duration of the war.

The meeting also discussed minor rules and a face-off would be required anytime a player handled a puck less than three seconds after it had been directed at his own feet.

Present at the meeting were Frank Calder, president of the league; Lester Patrick, New York Canadiens; James Norris, Detroit Red Wings; William J. Tobin, Chicago Blackhawks; Frank J. Selke, Toronto Maple Leafs; and R.R. Duncan, Boston Bruins.
