Receive details of death of Pt. Lawrence Doyle

The death of Pte. Lawrence "Pop" Doyle, a member of the P. E. I. Highlanders, which occurred in Newfoundland on Feb. 1, is believed to have been caused by "pneumonia along with exposure or pneumonia caused by exposure" according to word received this week by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Doyle, 22 Bayfield Street, Charlottetown. Full particulars of the circumstances of his death were forwarded by Major W. J. Reid.

Pte. Doyle was 21 years old. He was well known in hockey circles here where he played first with a midget and then with a junior team. He enlisted in September, 1939. At first he was a member of the pipe band but later transferred to one of the Unit's Companies.

Major Reid's letter disclosed that Pte. Doyle had been one of five soldiers detailed on a six-week signal course shortly before his sad death. A bad storm came up on Thursday and lasted until early Saturday evening. The following morning soldiers were out breaking the road and about two o'clock a civilian came along and informed Maj. Reid that one of his boys had been found out on the harbor ice that morning at 9:30 and had passed away about 11 o'clock after he was brought into camp.

On further inquiry he learned that after the storm on Saturday, Pte. Doyle with two other boys had started for town across the harbor (Continued on page 7, Col. 7)
